## **HAPPY HANUKKAH**

*Hanukkah, "The Festival of Lights" begins Tuesday, December 16th at sundown and ends Wednesday, December 24th this year. Hanukkah is observed starting on the 25th day of Kislev, which varies each year according to the Hebrew calendar and may occur at any time from late November to late December. Each night, throughout the 8 day holiday, a candle is lit and families join together as blessings are recited, Hanukkah songs are sung and perhaps the dreidel game is played. Each family has its own traditions which are followed each year. The lights serve as a reminder of the miracle of triumph and the rededication of the Holy Temple in Jerusalem. When visiting the United States in 1951, Israeli Prime Minister David Ben-Gurion presented a Hanukkah Menorah to President Harry Truman. The lighting of the Menorah has been celebrated in the White House by many Presidents since that time.*

## **KWANZAA**

*Kwanzaa is a seven day long celebration honoring African-American culture and is observed from December 26th to January 1st. It is based on seven principles of African heritage: Unity, Self Determination, Collective Work and Responsibility, Cooperative Economics, Purpose, Creativity and Faith. These positive ideals are at the center of the celebration for families as they join together to light the Kinara which is a special candleholder that holds seven candles. The center candle is black and represents the African people, three red candles represent struggles and challenges Africans have faced and three green candles represent hope, prosperity and good things to come. As each new candle is lighted, time is spent considering the principle for that particular day and on the last day of Kwanzaa, gifts are exchanged and a feast prepared. Specific traditions are established within the family and passed from one generation to the next.*

## **MERRY CHRISTMAS**

*Why do some say "Merry Christmas" instead of "Happy Holidays" or "Season's Greetings"? Christians around the world celebrate the birth of Christ at this season of the year. We look forward to "Christmas" morning, sing "Christmas" carols, attend "Christmas" Eve church services, exchange "Christmas" gifts and "Christmas" cards. Taking Christ out of our Christmas greeting and substituting it with "holiday" greetings, although it is commonplace these days, is now how most Christians would choose to express greetings to others at this special time of year. Taking Christ out of our greeting takes the heart out of the meaning of Christmas. As we celebrate this year, let us remember the reason for the season.....The birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ.*

## **SEASON'S GREETINGS TO ALL**

*Rather than dwell on our differences, let us join together in sharing with one another those traditions and principles that are meaningful to our families. Perhaps in some situations, a better compromise would be to say "Merry Christmas & Happy Holidays", thus no one would be omitted or offended and sincere greetings can be offered to all.*

## **SATURDAY - DECEMBER 6th - 10:30 am - 2:30 pm - Free Christmas Wrapping**

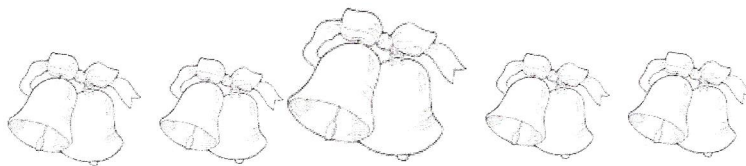

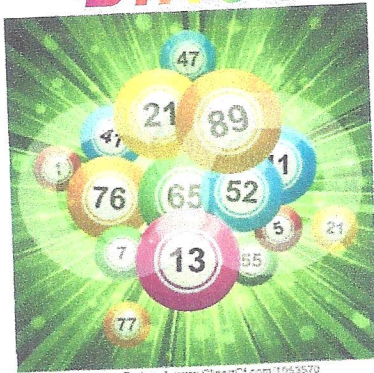

## Doing some work around the house?

The State of New Jersey Uniform Construction Code Regulations is the rules that govern when and if permits are required. The following are some examples but should not be considered an all inclusive list.

### Permits are required if:

- You cut away a wall or any portion thereof
- You cut any structural beam or bearing support
- Construct an addition or make alterations to your home i.e., enclosing a porch or patio cover
- Installing, replacing or re-locating a hot water heater
- Installing, replacing or re-locating any water drainage or venting
- Installation of heating or air conditioning systems
- Installation or upgrading any electrical wiring or plumbing

Permits are not necessary, but permission from the

### Co-Op is if:

- You add or replace shutters, awnings or railings
- Installation of Solar tubes
- Installation of Satellite Dish (TV)
- Window replacements
- Tree planting – location to be checked

Residents are required to have their contractor provide a certificate of insurance to the Trustees office before any work is started.

If you're having work done call the Maintenance Department and check if any of the above applies to your project.
