Trustees Notes:

The annual Budget Meeting will be held on June 22nd at 10:00am in the auditorium. Bus pick-ups will start at 9:00am for those not driving.

Additional crews are working on replacing the aluminum siding with new vinyl siding at this time. The majority of this village will be completed this year and the remainder not completed by this fall will be completed starting next spring.

Twenty five driveways will be replaced this year (complete new driveway installed). All driveways should be completed by 2018.

Homes for Sale in Village 1

There are currently 26 homes listed for sale on the Multiple Listing Service Realty website in this village. That number is the same as last month. The current listings range in price from \$28,500 to \$87,000.

It's not winter but.....

be forewarned now... if you're going to be away during the winter you MUST winterize your residence. Leaving the heat at 50 degrees won't help in the event of a power outage. Winterization currently costs \$100.00 which includes the cost of draining the home of all water, shutting off the heat, water heater etc and also includes the cost of de-winterizing before you return home. See rule # 46e of the rules and regulations of this village.

Tree Planting

Spring is here so now would be a good time to remind everyone that if you're planning to plant a tree or shrubs, there are rules for planting. No property boundary lines are to be formed. They must not block line of vision from intersections or driveways etc.

All requests for such plantings must be submitted to the Board of Trustees for approval. See rule # 12 of Rules and Regulations.

Doing some work around the house?

The State of New Jersey Uniform Construction Code Regulations is the rules that govern when and if permits are required. The following are some examples but should not be considered an all inclusive list.

Permits are required if:

- *You cut away a wall or any portion thereof*
- *You cut any structural beam or bearing support*
- *Construct an addition or make alterations to your home i.e., enclosing a porch or patio cover*
- *Installing, replacing or re-locating a hot water heater*
- *Installing, replacing or re-locating any water drainage or venting*
- *Installation of heating or air conditioning systems*
- *Installation or upgrading any electrical wiring or plumbing*

Permits are not necessary, but permission from the Co-Op is if:

- *You add or replace shutters, awnings or railings*
- *Installation of Solar tubes*
- *Installation of Satellite Dish (TV)*
- *Window replacements*
- *Tree planting – location to be checked*

Residents are required to have their contractor provide a certificate of insurance to the Trustees office before any work is started.

If you're having work done call the Maintenance Department and check if any of the above applies to your project.

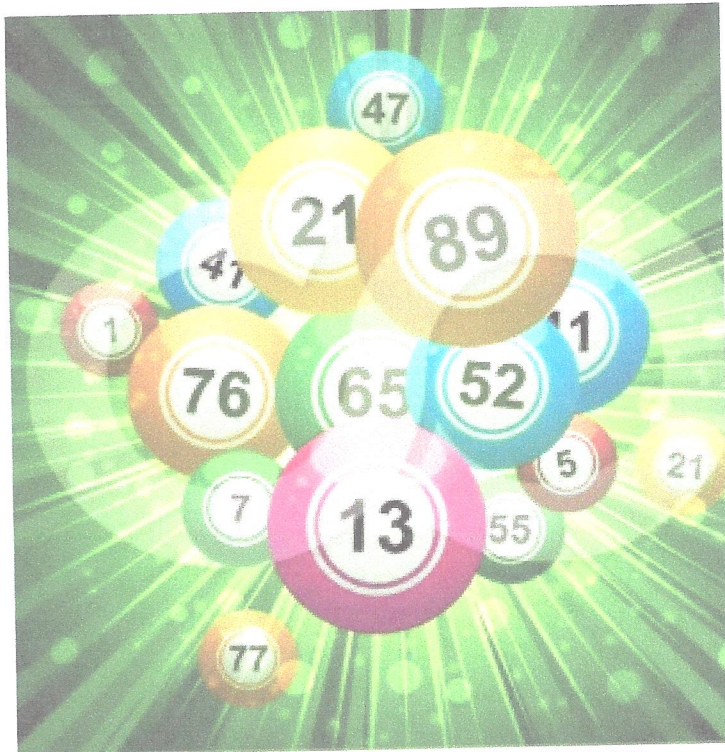
- Garbage Collection:** *Each Monday and Thursday - Do not place garbage outside of container until the morning of collection.*

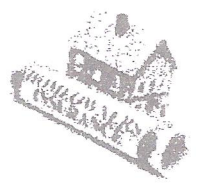

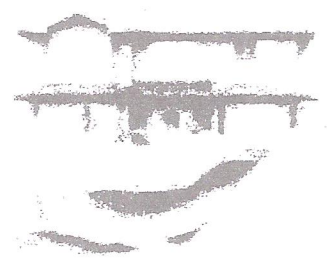

Bar-B-Q Grilles, Fire Pits, Chimneys

This is the time when you are making good use of your propane grille. Remember it must be no closer to the building than 10' when in use. It must not be used or stored under a covered patio. When not in use the propane tank should be turned off and no closer to the building than 5'. Be safe!! While we're on the subject of fires, remember fire pits and chimneys are not allowed in Village 1.

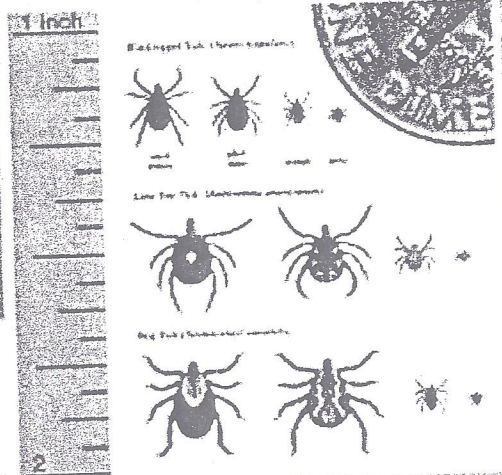
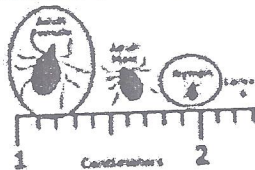
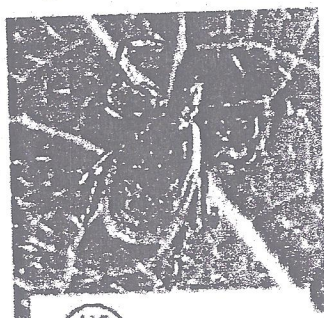
Health Threat Reporting:

Tick Borne 'Powassan Virus' Is Worse Than Lyme Disease:

Ticks in the New Jersey area have been found to carry a rare, potentially life-threatening virus. Doctors are warning that the Powassan virus, a rare, tick borne illness could be serious. It does not have a treatment or a cure. If bitten by an infected tick, transmission of the virus can occur within minutes; while the symptoms are similar to Lyme disease, they are more severe and may present one week to one month after becoming infected.

Symptoms can include:

- Fever
- Headache
- Vomiting,
- Weakness
- Confusion
- Loss of coordination
- Speech difficulties
- Seizures



Approximately half of survivors have permanent neurological symptoms, such as recurrent headaches, muscle wasting and memory problems. Approximately 10% of POW virus encephalitis cases are fatal. CBS NY and CDC)

The NJ Department of Health confirmed that a Warren County woman had died of the disease in July 2013. The disease is spread by two kinds of ticks: the blacklegged or deer tick, which can also carry Lyme disease, and the woodchuck tick. Tick activity slows when the temperature drops below 20 degrees, but their activity increases with the warmer weather.
