Homes for Sale in Village 1

There are currently 33 homes listed for sale on the Multiple Listing Service Realty website in this village. That number is up from last month which was 26. The current listings range in price from \$25,500 to \$72,000.

Additional crews are working on replacing the aluminum siding with new vinyl siding at this time. The majority of this village will be completed this year and the remainder not completed by this fall will be completed starting next spring.

Tree Planting

If you're planning to plant a tree or shrubs, there are rules for planting. No property boundary lines are to be formed. They must not block line of vision from intersections or driveways etc.

All requests for such plantings must be submitted to the Board of Trustees for approval. See rule # 12 of Rules and Regulations.

Ice Machine in Kitchen...

<u>DO NOT</u> touch/change controls for this machine. Recent changes made by those who do not understand were cause for a service call and found to be nothing wrong with the unit except wrong settings

Doing some work around the house?

The State of New Jersey Uniform Construction Code Regulations is the rules that govern when and if permits are required. The following are some examples but should not be considered an all inclusive list.

Permits are required if:

- You cut away a wall or any portion thereof
- You cut any structural beam or bearing support
- Construct an addition or make alterations to your home i.e., enclosing a porch or patio cover
- Installing, replacing or re-locating a hot water heater
- Installing, replacing or re-locating any water drainage or venting
- Installation of heating or air conditioning systems
- Installation or upgrading any electrical wiring or plumbing

Permits are not necessary, but permission from the Co-Op is if:

- You add or replace shutters, awnings or railings
- Installation of Solar tubes
- Installation of Satellite Dish (TV)
- Window replacements
- Tree planting location to be checked

Residents are required to have their contractor provide a certificate of insurance to the Trustees office before any work is started.

If you're having work done call the Maintenance Department and check if any of the above applies to your project.

Any payment not received in the office by 3:00 PM on the 10th of the month will be assessed a \$15.00 late fee. As they are due on the 1st of the month, after the 10 days THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS FOR WEATHER, ILLNESS ETC.

Bar-B-Q Grilles, Fire Pits, Chimneys

This is the time when you are making good use of your propane grille. Remember it must be no closer to the building than 10' when in use. It must not be used or stored under a covered patio. When not in use the propane tank should be turned off and no closer to the building than 5'. Be safe!! While we're on the subject of fires, remember fire pits and chimneys are not allowed in Village 1.



Hazardous waste will not be accepted from businesses, school boards or government agoldes. Any Ocean County, residential households and farmers are eligible for this free program. A divincy: license or tax bill will be adequate proof of residence. Our staff can advise you about any materials you are unsure of.

Acceptable Materials; paints/thinners/boat paint, solvents, pool chemicals, pesticides and herbicides, aerosol cans, auto products, toilet and driain detanear, silver polishase, oven cleaners, photographito foremicals, rug and uplotlety cleaners, polishes and bleaches, waste oil and used gasoline.

ALL THE ABOVE MATERIALS, EXCEPT OIL AND GASOLINE

Maximum volume per household is limited to 200 pounds of dry materials and 20 gallons of liquid. Please, no containers larger than 5 gallons. MUST BE IN ORIGINAL CONTAINERS

Unacceptable Materials: radioactive materials, dioxins, infectious waste ("Red Bag" wastes), explosives, unknown or unidentified materials. NO CONSTRUCTION WASTE OR ASBESTOS.
