#### Payments to the Co-Op!

Monthly Maintenance payments are due on the 1st of each month. You are given a 10 day grace period. Any payment not received in the office by 3:00 PM on the 10th of the month will be assessed a \$15.00 late fee. As they are due on the 1st of the month, after the 10 days THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS FOR WEATHER, ILLNESS ETC.

#### Power washing buildings

When we're power washing buildings, we must use your water to do so. We have no tank truck with which to transport water, therefore we must access water from the building. But remember, this water is applied under pressure so there's very little water used. You would not see any difference in your water usage. It's not like watering your grass..

#### Driveway Replacements

We're repaying 25 driveways this year. Not patching and seal coating, but removing the existing driveway and replacing it with a complete new re-paye.

We're also seal coating this year to extend the life of other driveways.

#### Library Reminders!!

First: We want to thank everyone who generously donates books to our library. That is the only way we get our books.

However: We have limited space so we cannot accept everything. We only keep books that were printed during the last 10 years. Please do not bring old books.

Also: There is no delivery service between libraries. If you take books out from Village 1 please return them to Village 1 otherwise they may never get back. It works the other way too. If you return books from other libraries to Village 1, they will probably just sit on the desk and never get back to their home library.

#### NOTICE!!

If you have a request for parking permits for additional vehicles, changes or additions to your home such as a patio, tree planting etc., notify the Trustees office. If you want to order repairs, call the Maintenance department.

#### In the auditorium.....

Fans are set on low speed. A/C is set at 75 degrees except during Residents Club meetings and Bingo when temperature is then at 74 degrees.

#### Doing some work around the house?

The State of New Jersey Uniform Construction Code Regulations is the rules that govern when and if permits are required. The following are some examples but should not be considered an all inclusive list.

#### Permits are required if:

- You cut away a wall or any portion thereof
- You cut any structural beam or bearing support
- Construct an addition or make alterations to your home i.e., enclosing a porch or patio cover
- Installing, replacing or re-locating a hot water heater
- Installing, replacing or re-locating any water drainage or venting
- Installation of heating or air conditioning systems
- Installation or upgrading any electrical wiring or plumbing

#### Permits are not necessary, but permission from the Co-Op is if:

- You add or replace shutters, awnings or railings
- Installation of Solar tubes
- Installation of Satellite Dish (TV)
- Window replacements
- Tree planting location to be checked

Residents are required to have their contractor provide a certificate of insurance to the Trustees office before any work is started.

If you're having work done call the Maintenance Department and check if any of the above applies to your project.

#### Tree Planting

If you're planning to plant a tree or shrubs, there are rules for planting. No property boundary lines are to be formed. They must not block line of vision from intersections or driveways etc. All requests for such plantings must be submitted to the Board of Trustees for approval. See rule # 12 of Rules and Regulations.

It is mandatory that this survey be completed and filed with the Co-Op office.
