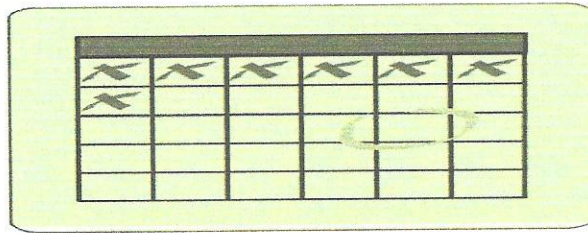

## ***Trustee Notes:***

### **Doing some work around the house?**

The State of New Jersey Uniform Construction Code Regulations is the rules that govern when and if permits are required. The following are some examples but should not be considered an all inclusive list.

#### ***Permits are required if:***

You cut away a wall or any portion thereof

You cut any structural beam or bearing support

Construct an addition or make alterations to your home i.e., enclosing a porch or patio cover

Installing, replacing or re-locating a hot water heater

Installing, replacing or re-locating any water drainage or venting

Installation of heating or air conditioning systems

Installation or upgrading any electrical wiring or plumbing

Replacing a shower or bath tub

***Changing kitchen cabinets even if there are no electrical or plumbing changes. Now required by Manchester Township.***

**Permits are not necessary, but you must get permission from the Co-Op if:**

You add or replace shutter, awnings or railing

Installation of Solar tubes

Installation of a Satellite Dish (TV)

Window replacements

Tree planting location

***Residents are required to have their contractor provide a certificate of insurance to the Trustee's office prior to any work performed. If you are having any work done call the Maintenance Department and check if any of the above applies to your project.***

### ***Satellite Dish***

To install a satellite dish you must:

Submit a request prior to installation to the Trustees office

Notify Maintenance when installer arrives

We will give you printed instructions for the installer

We inspect after installation. If it is not installed correctly, you will have to correct it.


The following information will be helpful when you prepare form PTR-1 and PTR-2, the application for New Jersey Property Tax Reimbursement. This is for the tax freeze. This is not the NJ Homestead Rebate.

1. BE SURE TO READ ALL THE QUALIFICATIONS IN THE PTR BOOKLET BEFORE FILING FOR A REIMBURSEMENT.
2. Save this letter, it is the written proof from the Co-Op that you need to show how much was paid in taxes. Send a copy of this letter with your forms, it will serve as proof and as a verification signature.

Other than supplying the tax figures for our residents, this office doesn't have anything to do with Property Tax Reimbursement. IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS, DO NOT CALL THE TRUSTEE'S OFFICE, YOU MUST CALL THE PHONE NUMBER IN THE INSTRUCTION BOOK.

## Maintenance News

### Snow removal Schedule

- Roads will be cleared as soon as 3" of snow has fallen (regardless of the time of day.)
- After the roads are passable, the Maint. Dept will start clearing the driveways and sidewalks.
- Duplex driveways will be cleared and should be considered as sidewalks.
- Quads will be cleared by pushing snow forward or to the side depending on the position of the quad.
- Sidewalks will be cleared as soon as possible, depending on the labor that is available.
- There will be no deviation from our snow removal program.
- It would be a good idea for each resident to stock their pantry with enough emergency food so that you will not have to venture out into bad weather. Also, snow removal takes longer with bigger snow storms.
- Keep a bag of Ice Melt on hand for your steps and sidewalks.

For those residents who are employed, your employment will not entitle you to priority snow clearing. We ask that all residents exercise understanding and patience. You can be an asset to our snow clearing operation by not calling the Maint. Dept to request individual attention. The ONLY people who can authorize snow clearing priority are the Trustees.

Special consideration for priority clearing will only be granted for medical appointments and

outpatient treatments. You will be required to furnish your doctor's name, phone number and time of appointment. Your appointment and the doctor's availability will be verified before any priority snow clearing is authorized. Your cooperation will be greatly appreciated.

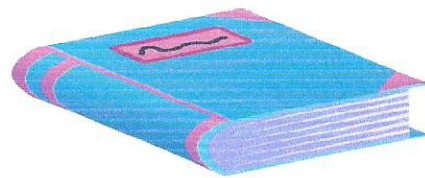
We always hope to see less homeless but this year there was an increase. Crestwood Village One did an outstanding job and you all should be very proud.



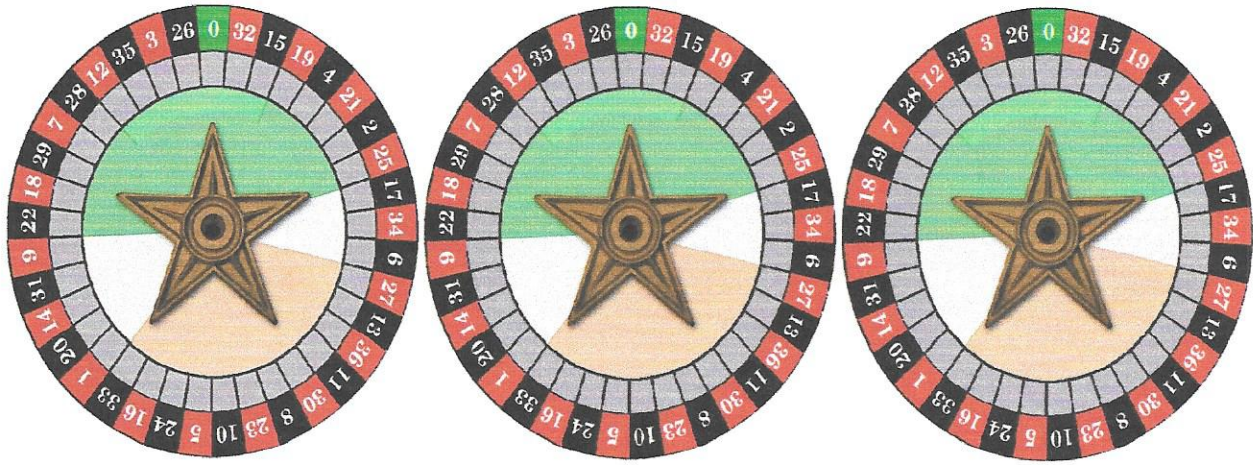
## **Your pet may be on the menu!**

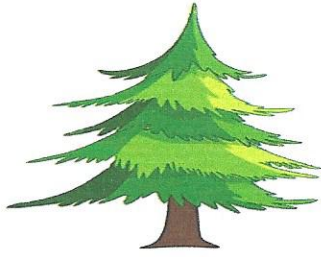

## **Spruce Tree Update**

**Last year, it was noticed by the board that several Spruce trees were dying very quickly. The scientific name Picea is commonly known as Spruce. These trees are commonly found in the cooler regions of the Northern Hemisphere. When planted outside of their natural growing zone, any tree can undergo certain stresses that can lead to additional problems. The Spruce trees in our villages were planted by unit/home owners in the past. Two such Spruce trees on Aster Place dropped their needles within three years. Since Conifers store most of their food in the needles, death was imminent. They were diagnosed with needle cast. The top three diseases that can affect these trees are needle cast, rusts and wood decay. The sudden dieback of these trees prompted the board to check out other Spruce trees.**

**It was determined that many more trees had dieback issues from other causes such as bagworm, spruce gall or borers. It was determined to remove these trees. The healthier Spruce trees will remain and be monitored.**

**Some people ask why we don't have these trees taken care of professionally. First of all, these trees were not here when we broke ground 50 years ago. Most of the specimen trees were purchased by a unit owner**

**which came from a nursery. They are not our responsibility to take care of.**

**Secondly, there is a cost factor that comes with a certified arborist's game plan for such care which can extend into several years. As the author of this article, I was such a licensed person both in lawn and tree care. The cost to take care of large specimen trees is not an option. However there is a another option that most villages follow and that is pruning.**

**Pruning out dead branches in trees such as Oaks and Silver Maples can prolong their live. Eventually, they will reach the end of their life cycle and will have to come down. As for our Conifers or Evergreen trees, pruning is selective and should be done by an experience person. There will be a time when those trees will have too much dieback and must be cut down.**

**Since Storm Sandy the board has been concerned about all of the deciduous trees that had to be cut down and leaving voids in our landscaping. The board has recently discussed having a planting guide for the village for both the Maintenance Dept and the unit owners to follow. The guide will include both deciduous trees as well as conifers. The growing zones, growth habits (size) and hardiness will be taken into consideration.**

**Overall, such a plan will be a great asset to future boards to follow and improve on. It will also be of great use to unit owners who are planting the wrong tree in the wrong place. The board expects to have this plan available later this spring and will you advise further.**
