PARKING AT QUADS!!

The issue of parking and spaces designated for guests at Quad buildings has become a major problem in many of these buildings. Letters to the Board of Trustees require hours of letter writing, discussion regarding how to alleviate the problem while still being fair to all involved

Our first problem is that this village was built in 1965 when almost every family had one car. Not many had more than one. Today two cars are standard in many families thus making a shortage of parking space and that doesn't begin to consider

visitors or guests.

Since the rules and regulations prohibit street parking between the hours of 1:00am and 5:00am, we've passed a resolution eliminating that restriction except at time of an impending snow storm. During such weather, vehicles would have to be parked at the Clubhouse parking lot.

The new rule will be as follows: You must park your car in your assigned space. Should you have a second car, you can use the space of another resident ONLY with their WRITTEN PERMISSION filed with the Co-Op office. You may also park "legally" on the street making sure not to block mail boxes, driveways, corners, etc. The car can stay parked overnight. This then leaves guest spaces for "GUESTS"... No resident can give any other resident permission to use a guest space as those spaces are for all residents in the building.

If you have visitors please advise them that if they have parked in a space other than those designated for "Guest" they must move their car to parking on the street as the homeowner will be fined for allowing use of another resident's parking space.

All residents will have to be mindful when backing out into the roadway as you would anywhere else.

We hope this eliminates the parking problems that many Quad residents have been enduring.

NOTICE!!

If you have a request for parking permits for additional vehicles, changes or additions to your home such as a patio, tree planting etc., notify the Trustees office. If you want to order repairs, call the Maintenance department.

Pet Waste!!

Solid pet waste must be removed immediately... Carry a waste pick-up bag with you when walking your dog and don't let your pet urinate on another residents grass.

Satellite Dish

If you're thinking of having a satellite dish installed on your home, you must:

- submit a request prior to installation to the Trustees office
- Advise Maint dept of date of installation
- Notify Maint when installer arrives
- We will give you printed installation instructions for the installer

We inspect after installation and if it is installed incorrectly, you will need to have it corrected,

FLUSHING FIRE HYDRANTS!

The Manchester Township Department of Public Utilities will be flushing fire hydrants for the months of April, May and June 2016. Hours will vary during the day as well as during the night. During this time, you will experience a difference in pressure and some discoloration. Run your COLD WATER TAP ONLY until it runs clear.

We cannot afford to lose our dumping permit due to those who will not follow the rules we all have to live by....

Tree Planting

Spring is here so now would be a good time to remind everyone that if you're planning to plant a tree or shrubs, there are rules for planting. No property boundary lines are to be formed. They must not block line of vision from intersections or driveways etc. All requests for such plantings must be submitted to the Board of Trustees for approval. See rule # 12 of Rules and Regulations.

Doing some work around the house?

The State of New Jersey Uniform Construction Code Regulations is the rules that govern when and if permits are required. The following are some examples but should not be considered an all inclusive list.

Permits are required if:

- You cut away a wall or any portion thereof
- You cut any structural beam or bearing support
- Construct an addition or make alterations to your home i.e., enclosing a porch or patio cover
- Installing, replacing or re-locating a hot water heater
- Installing, replacing or re-locating any water drainage or venting
- Installation of heating or air conditioning systems
- Installation or upgrading any electrical wiring or plumbing

Permits are not necessary, but permission from the Co-Op is if:

- You add or replace shutters, awnings or railings
- Installation of Solar tubes
- Installation of Satellite Dish (TV)
- Window replacements
- Tree planting location to be checked

Residents are required to have their contractor provide a certificate of insurance to the Trustees office before any work is started. If you're having work done call the Maintenance Department and check if any of the above applies to your project.

The following information will be helpful when you prepare form PTR-1 and PTR-2, the application for New Jersey Property Tax Reimbursement. This is for the tax freeze. This is not the NJ Homestead Rebate.

- 1. BE SURE TO READ ALL THE QUALIFICATIONS IN THE PTR BOOKLET BEFORE FILING FOR A REIMBURSEMENT.
- 2. Save this letter, it is the written proof from the Co-Op that you need to show how much was paid in taxes. Send a copy of this letter with your forms, it will serve as proof and as a verification signature.

Other than supplying the tax figures for our residents, this office doesn't have anything to do with Property Tax Reimbursement. IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS, DO NOT CALL THE TRUSTEE'S OFFICE, YOU MUST CALL THE PHONE NUMBER IN THE INSTRUCTION BOOK.

ALL THE ABOVE MATERIALS, EXCEPT OIL AND GASOLINE, MUST BE IN ORIGINAL CONTAINERS

Maximum volume per household is limited to 200 pounds of dry materials and 20 gallons of liquid. Please, no containers larger than 5 gallons.

Unacceptable Materials: radioactive materials, dioxins, infectious waste ("Red Bag" wastes), explosives, unknown or unidentified materials.

No construction waste or asbestos.
