**Garbage Collection:** Each Monday and Thursday - Do not place garbage outside of container until the morning of collection.

**R0cyclables:** **Friday October 14th & 28th-** Put recyclables out the night before pick-up especially in hot weather as heat and traffic conditions force the recycler to start exceptionally early!! Please put recyclables in containers, not plastic bags as it cannot be readily identified as garbage or recyclables. Only "button cell" and rechargeable batteries are recyclable. All other batteries go into regular garbage

**Manchester Brush P/U** **Tuesday October 4th-** Must be out by 7:00am ONCE PAST THEY WILL NOT RETURN...

**Village Light Bulk Pick-Up** **October 26th** - Last Wednesday of every month. Includes all electronics  
**NOTE:** Bulk pick-up is for oversize items - NOT entire house clean-up. We will pick up special clean-ups - but only by special arrangement with the Maintenance Dept.

## Trustees Notes.....

### **Election Day..**

There will be a Bus for the election on November 8th.

### **Political Signs**

As per the rules and regulations: Political signs may be up for a limited time. A maximum of 1 sign only may be displayed per unit. It must not exceed 18" x 24", must be within 6' of building, cannot obstruct sidewalks, may be displayed 10 days prior to election date and must be removed the day after the election. The one sign that is permitted at any time is a security sign denoting that your home is protected by a security system such as ADT, Infinity or Sloman's etc.

### **Satellite Dish**

If you're thinking of having a satellite dish installed on your home, you must:

- submit a request prior to installation to the Trustees office
- Advise Maint dept of date of installation
- Notify Maint when installer arrives
- We will give you printed installation instructions for the installer

**We inspect after installation and if it is installed incorrectly, you will need to have it corrected,**

When selling your home, the dish must be removed even if the new owner intends to have a dish installed, All dish services install a new dish upon installation of service and will not use a pre-existing unit and also will not remove a unit at end of service, That's your responsibility. This must be done prior to closing.

### **Merchandise Pick Ups**

If you have an oversized item that you would like to purchase from the Lowes in Manchester but cannot fit it in your vehicle, contact the maintenance department for help. If you purchase the item ahead of time and bring the pick-up receipt to the maintenance office they can pick up your item the next time they go out for supplies **FREE OF CHARGE... This service applies ONLY to the Lowes on Route 70 in Manchester.** This is a great bargain compared to paying the delivery charges from Lowes. Contact the maintenance department for more info.

### **Homes for sale in Village 1**

There are currently 20 homes listed for sale on the Multiple Listings Realty website in this village. The current listings range in price from \$24,900 to \$105,000.

## Trustees Notes - 2

### **Maintenance....**

Replacement of Aluminum siding is complete. This makes this Village the first Co-Op to eliminate much of the exterior maintenance on our buildings

### **Flushing Fire Hydrants...**

The Manchester Township Department of Utilities will be flushing hydrants for the months of October and November. Hours will vary during the day as well as during the night. During this time you will experience a difference in pressure and discoloration. Run the **COLD WATER TAP ONLY** until it runs clear..

### **Tree Replacements**

The trees that were removed by the Co-Op earlier this year due to being diseased are going to be replaced in the Spring. They're coming from General Landscaping and being planted at that time for optimum growth success.

### **It's Rule # 29...**

Dog barking or pet noise constitutes a nuisance. If you are unable to control your pet, you will be asked to take proper measures to correct the problem. If this continues, you may be assessed a fine.

### **AREA REPRESENTATIVES**

Reps are always needed! If you would like to help we'd be happy to have it. Call the Trustees office and they will put you in contact with Sal Sclamo who coordinates activities with the "Reps". At this time we are in need of someone to serve as "Rep" for District 6 that covers Hope Rd and Belhaven Ct.

## Info from CARES!

Somebody Cares will be offering free blood pressure readings to local residents on the First Thursday of each month from 10:00am to 12:00 noon. This was incorrectly reported as the second Thursday last month. Please correct your records to the first Thursday.

Food bank is at Village 6 the second Wednesday of each month. Line starts at 9:30am... **NO Early Birds!!!**

### **Coyote Alert !**

We have a very big Coyote living in the woods by the water tower on Azalea Drive. All pet owners should be aware and not let their pets out on a leash unattended (which is against the rules and regulations). The Coyote has been seen morning, daytime and evening hours. He does not frighten easily. He will watch you and not move.

Advise people not to think they are or you mistake them for a dog. They can and will attack if hungry or provoked.

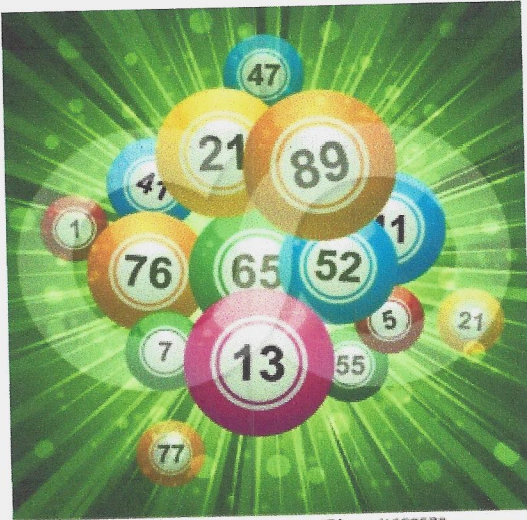
It is my understanding that many residents have seen them in and around the village and on the golf course. Heads up to all... Be alert....

## ***Medicare Part D***

### ***Open Enrollment is coming***

Prescription Drug Plan enrollment runs from **Oct 15th to Dec 7th**. People with Medicare can sign up for a prescription drug plan (PDP) or switch their current Part D plan in order to get the best coverage beginning Jan 2017.

Ocean County Senior Services will have representatives available for one-on-one assistance in comparing **ONLY** the prescription drug plans for 2017. For an appointment you must call the County Connection directly at 732-288-7777 to register.

## ***Feral Cats...***

Last month's newsletter mentioned new changes to Township Code Concerning Animals 16-018. The article where changes were made refers specifically to Feral Cats. Approximately 600 cats are humanely euthanized annually by the Township.

Since the majority of public feedback favored a trap-neuter-return (TNR) program as a means of addressing feral cats to control the unwanted presence of these animals in the community, this program has been adopted by this Township.

Article IV, Chapter 101, Section 37, has been added

A. No person shall own, keep or harbor any cat within the Township except within the provisions of this article.

B. No person shall feed any feral cat out of compliance of above

101-40 - Violations & penalties

A. Any person violating this ordinance shall be given written warning by Animal Control Officer

B. Subsequent violations punishable by fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$500.

C. If violation continues, each day it continues constitutes a separate offense.

The full explanation of this Trap-Neuter-Return program is much too long to try to explain in this newsletter. If you're interested in more information, contact Animal Control at Manchester Township.

## **Doing some work around the house?**

The State of New Jersey Uniform Construction Code Regulations is the rules that govern when and if permits are required. The following are some examples but should not be considered an all inclusive list.

### **Permits are required if:**

- You cut away a wall or any portion thereof
- You cut any structural beam or bearing support
- Construct an addition or make alterations to your home i.e., enclosing a porch or patio cover
- Installing, replacing or re-locating a hot water heater
- Installing, replacing or re-locating any water drainage or venting
- Installation of heating or air conditioning systems
- Installation or upgrading any electrical wiring or plumbing

### **Permits are not necessary, but permission from the Co-Op is if:**

- You add or replace shutters, awnings or railings
- Installation of Solar tubes
- Installation of Satellite Dish (TV)
- Window replacements
- Tree planting – location to be checked

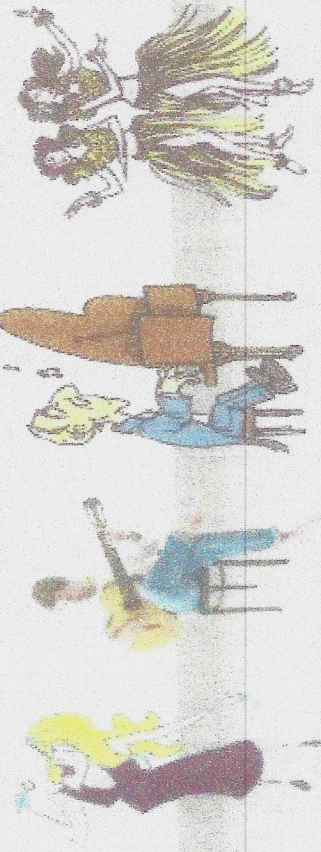
