

#### **Board of Trustees Election**

Three Trustees terms of office expire this year. Those up for re-election are John Sprofera, Maryann Riotto and Carl Hart. John currently serves as Vice President, Maryann serves as Secretary and Carl serves as Treasurer.

If you would be interested in serving as a Trustee, you must be a certificate holder and submit a one page resume and a form containing twenty five (25) signatures (available at the Trustees office) of Village 1 certificate holders, including their addresses to the Trustees office by no later than 3:00 pm on Thursday, April 13, 2017. Your resume will be published in the May newsletter. You will then have an opportunity to give a 5 minute presentation of yourself at the May Residents Club meeting on the 8th and the Trustee's open meeting on May 25, 2017. The election of Trustees will be held on June 12th from 9:00am till 12:00 noon in the clubhouse auditorium. Applicants are elected as a Trustee and not for a specific office on the Board. The offices for each Trustee are determined by a vote from within the members of the Board.

#### Doing some work around the house?

The State of New Jersey Uniform Construction Code Regulations is the rules that govern when and if permits are required. The following are some examples but should not be considered an all inclusive list.

#### Permits are required if:

- You cut away a wall or any portion thereof
- You cut any structural beam or bearing support
- Construct an addition or make alterations to your home i.e., enclosing a porch or patio cover
- Installing, replacing or re-locating a hot water heater
- Installing, replacing or re-locating any water drainage or venting
- Installation of heating or air conditioning systems
- Installation or upgrading any electrical wiring or plumbing

#### Permits are not necessary, but permission from the Co-Op is if:

- You add or replace shutters, awnings or railings
- Installation of Solar tubes
- Installation of Satellite Dish (TV)
- Window replacements
- Residents are required to have their contractor provide a certificate of insurance to the Trustees office before any work is started. If you're having work done call the Maintenance Department and check if any of the above applies to your project.

Hazardous waste will not be accepted from businesses, school boards or government agencies. Only Ocean County residential households and farmers are eligible for this free program. A driver's license or tax bill will be adequate proof of residence. Our staff can advise you about any materials you are unsure of.

**Acceptable Materials:** paints/thinners/boat paint, solvents, pool chemicals, pesticides and herbicides, aerosol cans, auto products, toilet and drain cleaners, silver polishes, oven cleaners, photographic chemicals, rug and upholstery cleaners, polishes and bleaches, waste oil and used gasoline.

#### ALL THE ABOVE MATERIALS, EXCEPT OIL AND GASOLINE, MUST BE IN ORIGINAL CONTAINERS

Maximum volume per household is limited to 200 pounds of dry materials and 20 gallons of liquid. Please, no containers larger than 5 gallons.

Unacceptable Materials: radioactive materials, dioxins, infectious waste ("Red Bag" wastes), explosives, unknown or unidentified materials.

No construction waste or assestos.

2016 PROPERTY TAX REIMBURSEMENT PTR-1 & PTR-2

THIS LETTER SERVES AS WRITTEN VERIFICATION AND CERTIFICATION FOR THE AMOUNT OF PROPERTY TAXES PAID BY EACH RESIDENT ACCORDING TO THE TYPE OF UNIT OWNED. ALSO, THIS STATEMENT TAKES THE PLACE OF THE REQUIRED SIGNATURE OF THE TAX COLLECTOR OR THIS OFFICE.

The following information will be helpful when you prepare form PTR-1 and PTR-2, the application for New Jersey Property Tax Reimbursement. This is for the tax freeze. This is not the NJ Homestead Rebate.

- 1. BE SURE TO READ ALL THE QUALIFICATIONS IN THE PTR BOOKLET BEFORE FILING FOR A REIMBURSEMENT.
- 2. Save this letter, it is the written proof from the Co-Op that you need to show how much was paid in taxes. Send a copy of this letter with your forms, it will serve as proof and as a verification signature.

Other than supplying the tax figures for our residents, this office doesn't have anything to do with Property Tax Reimbursement. IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS, <u>DO NOT CALL THE TRUSTEE'S OFFICE</u> YOU MUST CALL THE PHONE NUMBER IN THE INSTRUCTION BOOK.
