### First and foremost we wish happy Holidays to all for the most wonderful time of the year.

**Let's talk parking...** Other villages are not allowing on street parking mostly between midnight and six AM. Some are towing cars if parked during those periods of time. Should your car be towed it will cost you approximately \$250.00 to get it back. Some of the villages doing this towing have "finger streets" which have limited access and egress making parking a nightmare for emergency vehicles, fire trucks, police etc. The point can easily be made that they must do something to avoid possible major problems. Those villages have larger clubhouses with larger parking areas than we in Village 1 have. With those larger parking areas some villages will rent parking space or spaces for those residents with more than one car/vehicle.

We in Village 1 have a smaller clubhouse with a much smaller parking area but we do have the advantage of **NOT** having "finger streets". Thus we allow on street parking day or night. **The only exception being in the event of an impending snow fall NO ON STREET PARKING is allowed.** If you are on the street during a snow fall your vehicle will be plowed in, you'll be charged \$60.00 to dig it out and you'll be fined for leaving it on the street. You must move vehicles to overnight parking at the clubhouse (to be removed as soon as snow has been cleared) or the use of a neighbors space temporarily with that neighbors permission.

With all that being said the on street parking of your vehicle must be parked legally – On the right side of the road – not blocking mailboxes, neighbors parking spots, driveways, corners etc. While this village has not had any problems with parking, we want to keep it that way. Please do your part...

### **MAINTENANCE**

### MINUTE

With our first encounter with some snow recently, I figured this is as good a time as any to talk about the guidelines for when the white stuff starts falling and how Crestwood Village 1 manages the work associated with plowing and snow removal. The procedure and information provided below comes from the Board of Trustees. The biggest things we can request is that all residents stay inside when the street and driveway clearing is underway and to please, please exercise patience and understanding during these times.

Special consideration for priority clearing will only be arranged for medical appointments and outpatient treatments. You are required to provide the Trustees Office in advance a doctor's note listing dates and times for appointments. After verifying the information provided, the Board of Trustees will authorize and prioritize the clearing of these units. The Board of Trustees will not make special arrangements for those that are employed, it will not entitle you to priority snow clearing. Please do not call the Maintenance Department to request individual attention, the only people that can authorize priority snow plowing are the Trustees.

- \* Roads will not be plowed until there is 3" of snow accumulation;
- \* When icy conditions are observed, ice melt will be applied to the roads;
- \* NO on-street parking for impending snow storms. Vehicles left on the street will receive a fine of \$50.00. Parking on the grass is not acceptable. If you do leave your vehicle on the road during plowing activities, in addition to the fine, you will be plowed in. If you require assistance to clear your vehicle out, you will be assessed a \$60 charge for this service;
- \* Residents are not to push, shovel, blow or deposit snow onto village roadways;
- \* When the roadways are made passable, the Maintenance Department will begin to clear driveways and sidewalks;
- \* Duplex driveways will be cleared and treated as sidewalks;
- \* Quad driveways will be cleared by pushing the snow forward or to side when available, depending on the position of the unit;
- \* Sidewalks will be cleared as soon as possible, depending on man-power available:
- \* Keep a bag of Ice Melt on hand for your steps and sidewalk area;
- \* The Maintenance Department has 10 pound bags of ice melt available, 1 bag for \$4 and 2 bags for \$7; and THERE WILL BE NO DEVIATION FROM OUR SNOW REMOVAL PROGRAM.

### THE MANCHESTER COORDINATING COUNCIL (MCC) MEETING October 28, 2019

**Lee Gandolfi** stated since there has been no real response for the Executive Committee, the time to apply has been extended until the end of the year. This committee coordinates the information for the meetings.

In the October 19<sup>th</sup> Manchester Times, there was a comprehensive article on the **Senate Bill S2425** impacting 55+ communities.

Save Barnegat Bay – this is on the ballot trying to get money for this cause.

**Energy aggregation started in October with a meter reading**. Future bills will be from Constellation. New people moving in can sign up whenever they want. They may call the Township if interested.

Signs are up regarding parking on Schoolhouse Road and Wranglebrook. The ordinance took effect October 16<sup>th</sup>.

The Lifetime Assistance program was discussed. Manchester Police Chief is looking into it. The idea is that people that are alone have a box outside with a key that only Police have access to enter the dwelling, instead of breaking down the door. Cares also has a daily phone call service for people that are alone.

There is a senior playground at Harry Wright Lake. One of the Villages is interested in building one on their premises. She will check with the Clerks office for ideas concerning such.

Santander Bank on the corner of Route 530 & Schoolhouse Road has been sold to a Doctor for his practice. Demolition will begin on November 25<sup>th</sup>. Other vacant buildings in the area are being used as a tax write off.

There will be a new Dollar Store going up in the near future next to the Rite Aid in the empty lot.

The next MCC Meeting is scheduled for November 25th at 1:30 in Village 5.




