Some Rules Have Changed Over The Years And Permits Are Now Needed For Kitchen Cabinet Replacements As Well As Any Plumbing Or Electrical Changes.

Please Check New Single Stream Recycling Now In Effect. Also Remember To Break Down Boxes. When Empty They Are Light And Easily Become "Airborne" They Don't Need To Be Tied But Do Need To Have Some Kind Of Weight To Hold Them Down Until The Recycling Truck Arrives. A Cover To Contain Your Cans And Bottles Is Necessary Also In Order To Prevent Lightweight Aluminum Cans From Decorating The Neighborhood.

RULES

Obey the Rules or Pay the Fines

Interior structural changes, such as installing a door, removing a partition or wall, changes to electrical wiring or plumbing, etc., require approval from the Board of Trustees. These changes, if not done properly, can cause structural damage to the building, fire hazards in the case of improper electrical work and health hazards in the case of improper plumbing repairs/installations. The member indemnifies and hold the Co-op harmless for any injuries or damages caused by changes they make or that are made at their request by another party. The members certificate may incur a lien for all unpaid damages or losses caused by such construction. Before starting any construction/repairs/changes, the member must submit a letter of request and the Trustees office must receive a Certificate of Insurance from all contractors for all work which is performed within the Co-op. This certificate must include general liability, auto insurance, workers compensation, employers liability, and show that Crestwood Village Co-op, Inc. is an additional insured for all work performed in the Village by said contractor. This certificate will be reviewed, then approved or declined by the Trustees office. If approval is given, the Association is not approving, guaranteeing, or endorsing the contractor. We are strictly verifying that the contractor has met our insurance guidelines. Any modifications if not approved by the Board of Trustees must be returned to the original condition when the unit is sold.

MAINTENANCE

MINUTE

Happy Holidays Residents of Village 1! This month, I would like to touch on basic home care for when you the residents are traveling for an extensive amount of time during the winter months, whether it is visiting family, vacationing or heading south for the winter. Nothing would be worse than coming back from a nice relaxing vacation and walking in your residence to find a pipe rupture while you're were gone and walking into a flood. I would like to discuss some steps to help prevent this from happening and other things you can do to keep your house from developing other issues.

Depending on the duration of your time away, you might want to consider doing one of the following:

- If leaving for a weekend or even a week, make sure your heat is on. Maintenance generally recommends leaving thermostats at a minimum of 55 degrees. Open any cabinetry where there is water piping to allow warmer air in there to help avoid freezing pipes. By all means you can leave it warmer, but definitely open up those cabinet doors below your bathroom and kitchen sinks. If you do have a piping issue and there is damage, the homeowner will be responsible for the repairs and the cleanup.
- If traveling for an extended period of time during the winter (month or more), you should consider winterizing your residence. This will provide a piece of mind that the water to your unit has been shut off and should not be an issue. You can elect to have the electricity to your unit remain on so it's not too cold upon your return. Winterizations are a scheduled task through the Maintenance Department and should be coordinated with us. The current charge for winterizations is \$100 (\$90 Maintenance charge and \$10 to Manchester Township). It is imperative that you also schedule a dewinterization as early as possible if you know the date of your return, to accommodate the Maintenance and Manchester Townships schedules. Typically, we request 7 10 days notice for dewinterizations. There is no charge for this as it is captured in the initial \$100 payment. If there is a pipe related failure and you are winterized, that will become the responsibility of the Co-op to repair and cleanup.
- To prevent mildew issues inside your residence, specifically when it comes to clothing
 in your closets, everyone should get in the practice of leaving your closet doors open
 to allow air to circulate. Dark, enclosed spaces are notorious for the development of
 the white spots on the clothing, especially on leather and suede materials.

Just a reminder that 10 pound bags of ice melt are available through the Maintenance Department, 2 bags for \$7. Pickup and delivery options are available.

November 25, 2019

Speaker Detective Joe Festede from Manchester Police Department discussed scams and how not to become a victim. Use common sense, if it sounds to good to be true, it most likely is! Last year, 256 scams of fraud were reported in Manchester. The most common scams are lottery, IRS, utility bills and relatives in jail. Do not give any information over the phone ever! When you click on different Facebook ads certain links get your computers IP address and can access your computer along with all your personal information. Federal agencies never call and ask for money.

Sachiko Komagata from Georgian Court University spoke about a research program of intergenerational possibilities creating and conducting younger and older groups joining in activities together. She handed out survey's along with consent forms for anyone interested. You can pick up these forms in the office.

The overnight parking on Wranglebrook has become less of a severe problem. Schoolhouse and Wranglebrook Roads repaying has started.

Census for 2020 is starting. You will receive letters or you can fill out forms online. It's very important you do so in order for senior communities to receive grants they are entitled to.




