Crestwood Village 1 Rules & Regulations

Continued from November's NL

Amended 06/27/2019

RULES

Obey the Rules or Pay the Fines

26. Residents shall not install any air-conditioning or heating equipment in any dwelling unit without prior written consent of the Trustees. Failure to adhere to this rule may result in exclusion by our Insurance Company and will lead to the removal of such equipment at the expense of the resident. Member is responsible for any damages, injuries or costs caused by their installation, if approved. Room air conditioners must be permanently mounted through the wall and not in the window opening. If permission is granted for this work, permits from Manchester Township must be obtained.
27. One domestic pet may be kept in a unit with the express consent of the Trustees. If loss of that pet occurs, application for another pet must be made to the Trustees. Dogs and cats may not run free at any time, even after dark. They must be on a leash at all times when out of doors. Pets may not urinate on any lawns and droppings on any Co-op property must be cleaned up immediately by the owner or guardian and deposit said bags in their own garbage receptacle, not another resident's garbage receptacle. (See Pet Policy)

Good Day Residents of Crestwood Village 1

Due to an inordinate amount of calls to the Maintenance Department around the Holiday season for clogged or slow draining kitchen sinks, I wanted to take this opportunity to discuss some preventive measures to help eliminate these issues and what you can do to help the Maintenance Department resolve the clogs or slow draining sinks. The majority of these calls to the Maintenance Department appear to be related to grease from cooking activities going down the kitchen drains and solidifying in the plumbing. A rule of thumb, if you are cooking and are emptying your pots or pans down your kitchen sink drain, is to simply allow the hot water from the faucet to run before, during and after. This hot water will help prevent the grease from causing a clog by keeping it liquified to move freely through the drains. You should not use boiling hot water, as this could damage to your plumbing.

Often times, our first instinct when encountering a clogged or slow draining sink is to get some Drano or Liquid Plumber and dump it right in. Although this will work from time to time, residual amounts will remain

in the drain pipes in the crawlspace...if it manages to remove the blockage at all. When the situation arises where a drain cleaner was used and it doesn't work to eliminate the blockage, the Maintenance Department is typically contacted. When Maintenance has to open up the main drain pipe to physically try to remove the blockage, they are routinely sprayed with this caustic liquid and it does cause burns to clothing and even worse, skin. That said, if you are experiencing a slow draining sink or a complete clog, please contact the Village 1 Maintenance Department prior to adding any drain cleaner. In most cases, the clogs are easily corrected by Maintenance and sometimes that easy fix could become hazardous to our guys attempting to fix these clogged sinks.

Please remember that these buildings are nearly 60 years old and that means 60 years of wear and tear on the plumbing in most cases and that you share plumbing with your roof neighbors and a clogged main drain in your unit could result in negative effects to them as well.

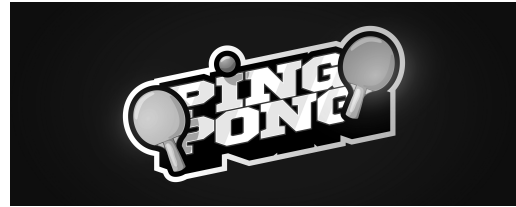

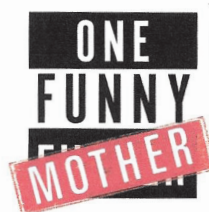



Send a copy of this letter with your forms, it will serve as proof and as a verification signature.

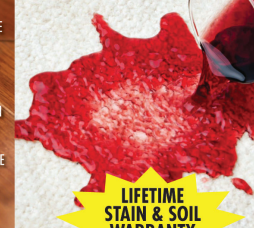

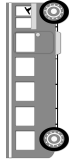
