All recycling must be placed in a container curbside, should it be out in any type of plastic bag it will not be picked up until the owner places the recycling in a container.

### Doing some work around the house...

**PERMITS** 

The State of New Jersey Uniform Construction Code Regulations is the rules that govern when and if permits are required. The following are some examples but should not be considered an all inclusive list.

### Permits are required if:

- You cut away a wall or any portion thereof
- You cut any structural beam or bearing support
- Construct an addition or make alterations to your home i.e. — enclosing a porch or patio cover
- Installing, replacing or re-locating a hot water heater
- Installing, replacing or re-locating any water drainage or venting
- Installing of heating or air conditioning systems
- Installation or upgrading any electrical wiring or plumbing

### Permits are not necessary, but permission from the Co-op is if:

- You add or replace shutters, awnings or railings
- Installation of Solar tubes
- Installation of Satellite Dish (TV)
- Window replacements
- Residents are required to have their contractor provide a certificate of insurance to the Trustees office before any work is started. If you're having work done call the Maintenance Department and check if any of the above applies to your project.

# MAINTENANCE

### **MINUTE**

### **Hello Residents of Village 1!**

As some of you might have heard or saw in last month's newsletter, Manchester Township is funding a water meter upgrade project. This is a mandatory upgrade and will take place starting on August 31, 2020 and will run for approximately ten (10) weeks. During this time, you will see Manchester Township's approved subcontractor, VEPO Metering, going in and out of crawlspaces to complete the replacements. Technicians from VEPO Metering will have vehicles and uniforms on stating who they are with. VEPO Metering will not have to enter your home, but might ring your bell or knock on your door as a courtesy they are there and that the water to the building will be turned off temporarily. The entire water meter replacement of a single unit should take approximately an hour, with your water being affected for 15-20 minutes. If for some reason they cannot complete the work, a notice will be left on the door if they don't speak to your directly. You will not need to be home at the time the work is being completed.

The proposed schedule will have VEPO Metering starting at 1 Valley Stream and continuing numerically until the final building located at 619 Willow Lane is completed. Additionally, since we are still under the shadow of the COVID-19 Pandemic, residents are requested to maintain a safe six (6) foot separation to maintain acceptable social distancing. All residents are to remain out of the crawlspaces while this work is underway and allow the technicians from VEPO Monitoring to complete their work in a timely fashion, as we do have 355 buildings and 1,016 meters to replace!

Just as a reminder, this is a Manchester Township mandatory upgrade program and the Village 1 Board of Trustees/Co-op and the Maintenance Department have no involvement or say with the decision to replace these meters or any of the work required to complete the work.
