Trustees Notes...

Hopefully by now, we are through the worst of the winter season. If we should have any more plowable snow, please consider your neighbors. If plows come to do your driveway and you pull your car out for them, please leave the plow plenty of room to work and return to your spot as soon as they are done. Don't pull your car out until they are starting your driveway as too many vehicles on the street are the in the way of the plows.

With warmer weather on the way it is a good time to start cleaning up our yards. Manchester Township will be doing their **Leaf and Brush** pickup on **March 23rd**. This must be in **brown bags**. They can be purchased by calling our maintenance department at **732-350-2202**. You get 5 bags for \$2 and they will be delivered to you. Payment is due at delivery. Maintenance only delivers these bags 1 day a week so get your orders in early.

With warmer weather coming, just a few reminders. **Dogs may NOT be outside unleashed or unattended.** You may tie your dog outside ONLY if you are sitting outside with the dog. This is the time of year when raccoons are looking to nest. Watch for signs of torn soffits or ripped up shingles and report this immediately to maintenance. These critters may be trying to get in your attic and will cause substantial damage.

As I drive around the Village, I notice many vehicles parking illegally. Commercial vehicles may not park on Village streets or driveways. Unregistered or inoperable vehicles are not permitted. Inspection stickers must not be expired. Backing in to your parking space is also not allowed. Guest spots are for guests of that buildings guests only. A second vehicle belonging to your residence does not allow you to use a guest spot. This seems to be the number 1 reason for towing. You may park a second vehicle on the street or temporarily in the Clubhouse parking lot. If your vehicle is towed, you will have a large bill to have the tow company release your vehicle. This can easily be avoided simply by following the rules.

Spring is coming! We look forward to the warmer days.

Free Self-Management Courses Take Control of Your Health and The Diabetes Self-Management Workshop

The most vulnerable population to be affected by COVID 19 are those over 60 with a chronic condition such as diabetes, high blood pressure, asthma, or heart disease. It is especially important currently, to learn and know how to manage these conditions.

Two programs are being offered virtually: **Take Control of Your Health**, for any chronic condition and **The Diabetes Self-Management Workshop** for anyone with diabetes or pre-diabetes. Both workshops are evidence-based, six-week free programs developed by Stanford University for Seniors 60+ and led by local experienced, trained, and certified volunteers.

The programs address issues such as getting a good night's sleep, dealing with emotions and stress, healthy eating, communication with health care providers and family, relieving pain and fatigue, and much more. These skills and others are taught through information presented by the leaders, from the free book all participants receive, *Living a Healthy Life with Chronic Conditions*, and through participants sharing life experiences.

During COVID, when people are feeling isolated, it is important to find a safe place to share concerns and to learn that we are not alone. Participants will gain a sense of control over things they can change, through the exercises practiced during the program, and through comfort and support received from each other.

This program is funded through the Office of Senior Services and provided free of charge to participants. A computer or tablet that has a camera and microphone is needed to take part. Information on the use of zoom will be provided.

Hello Residents of Village 1,

With the waves of inclement weather that we are receiving this year, there is a significant increase of power outages in and around our neighborhood. Many of our provided electrical utilities are roadside in transformers or overhead utility lines and it only takes a single incident to knock out a very large service area in the villages.

If all the power in your building is out, it is safe to assume you are experiencing large outage that is affecting the Village as a whole. Check with a neighbor or look out your window to see if street lights or if there are other lights out in the area. If you do feel that there is a power outage that is affecting the area, you should call JCP&L directly for updates.

THE CONTACT NUMBER FOR JCP&L IS 1-800-662-3115.

This should be your first call and they should be able to tell you there is an outage and will provide an approximate time that the power should be restored. The Maintenance Department will more than likely be out of power as well. The Trustees Office, Maintenance Department and the Emergency Line are not for reporting whole building outages and messages should not be left on these answering machines.

If you are experiencing a partial outage in your building then you should absolutely contact the Maintenance Department. More than likely a breaker "tripped" and can usually be easily reset. Please do not hesitate to reach out to Maintenance and we can try to walk you through how to reset the breaker or we can send a technician to come and take a look for you.

Please make sure you are well provisioned prior to any upcoming forecasted storms, as travelling during storms or storm cleanup is not a good idea. There are emergency personnel on the roads and in the village working to make things safe.

Hope everyone stays safe and remains healthy during the rest of the winter months!

This month we'll continue our discussion on controlling the exposure for a desired effect. Let's concentrate on Aperture priority. The camera's aperture is the adjustable opening that lets light onto the sensor or film. It works similar to the iris in your eye, opening wide to let in a lot of light, or closing down to let in less light.

With Aperture priority you choose the F-stop and the camera will choose the shutter speed. This is useful when you want to control how much of your image is in focus. With large F-numbers (F16 or F22) most or all of the image will appear sharp. At smaller numbers (F2.8 or F4) less will be in focus. If you want to blur your background (portraits) simply choose a small number. If you want most or all of your image in focus (landscape images) use the large number.

If your camera has the picture icons choose the mountain if you want a lot in focus and choose the portrait or sports icon if you want less in focus.

2. Save this letter, it is the written proof from the Co-Op that you need to show how much was paid in taxes.

Send a copy of this letter with your forms, it will serve as proof and as a verification signature.

Other than supplying the tax figures for our residents, this office doesn't have anything to do with Property Tax Reimbursement. IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS, <u>DO NOT CALL THE TRUSTEE'S OFFICE</u>, YOU MUST CALL THE PHONE NUMBER IN THE INSTRUCTION BOOK.


Why is it I can recall my brother's telephone number instantly, but can't remember my own cell phone number?
