NOTE: Bulk pick-up is for oversize items – **NOT entire house clean-up.** We will pick up **special clean-ups**, but only by special arrangement with the Maintenance Dept.

Yard Debris Every Thursday. Remember leaves, needles and pine

cones ONLY!!! CANNOT be picked up in plastic bags. The refuse center will not let us dump plastic bags. It MUST be in BIO-DEGRADABLE PAPER BAGS ONLY.

Available at maintenance dept. or local stores.

Brush / Branches Every Thursday. At the curb.

Lawn Cut Dates — Tentative July 8, 19 & 29 — Cutting, Curb Lines, edging once.

Senior Security Matters

Online Order Apprehension

Many Seniors express strong apprehensions regarding ordering food and other items from online retailers. The primary reason for the reluctance is a fear of having their bank accounts compromised, but there is an easy solution for this issue.

Quite simply, it is by NOT using your bank account card or other credit cards to shop online, but instead by purchasing a **Pre-filled Debit card.** This is how it works:

Retail stores such as pharmacy chains, stock a variety of gift cards and other purchase card items. Select a pre-filled Debit card [i.e. **VISA ONE VANILLA** brand]. Pay for the card by 'filling' it with an amount up to \$500, adding approximately \$5 to pay for the card. It has its own CC number, expiration date and security number.

Order online using this card. There is NO connection between the card and your bank account, or credit card account.

Points to remember:

If lost, it is nearly impossible to recover remaining money on the card, so it is important to write the numbers down.

It can be difficult to return items.

Most of these cards are not refillable, therefore you need to pay the \$5 fee for each new card.

When you get down to a small balance on the card, use it in the supermarket to finish off the card.

I did notice these cards are sold in Dollar store chains, though I do not know if the fee for them is less than \$5 there.


Our thanks to **Arlene Sauer**, the head of our library, who has recently retired. She has been a tireless worker, and we wish her well.

MAINTENANCE MINUTE

Hello Residents of Village 1,

Happy Summer! Hope everyone is managing to stay cool out there! It seems that everyone is a lot happier with these mask restrictions being lifted. For the past month, the Maintenance Department has handled 382 work orders. This month I would like to talk about the procedure for disposing of your household trash, recyclables and bulk trash pickups. Every week we are receiving calls with residents not adhering to the correct protocol when it comes to getting rid of their household garbage.

Household Trash

Crestwood Village 1 offers weekly trash pick-up services on Mondays and Thursdays, please check the Village Newsletter for your scheduled pickup days when your date falls on a holiday. The household trash should be limited to food scraps, paper garbage or other trash that fits inside of your standard trash bag. These bags must be put into the trash receptacles the night before or the morning of your scheduled trash pickup day by 6:00 AM. If you have an overabundance of garbage bags that cannot fit into the trash can, you can neatly place them on top of the can or next to the can. Please do not exceed 2 - 3 bags of trash. We strongly urge against placing these bags out until the morning of your pickup day to reduce the chance for critters to help themselves and cause an unsightly mess. Furniture, rugs or other large items will require a separate pickup. Paint and chemicals are not permitted to be thrown out into the household trash. Please contact the Maintenance Department if you feel your household trash was missed on your scheduled pickup days. If you do put any items too large for the garbage trucks to receive and the Maintenance Department has to come to remove these items, you will be charged accordingly.

Recyclables

Manchester Township provides pickup of recyclables on a bi-weekly schedule, please check the Village Newsletter for dates for your scheduled pickup days. Recyclables must be placed in a plastic container or trash can, bags of any variety will not be picked up. Your recyclables should be placed out by your garbage can on the night prior to your pick-up or the morning of your pickup day by 6:00 AM. Newspapers, periodicals or magazines can be bound in small bundles and placed out at the same time. If you feel that your recyclables

were missed on your scheduled pickup days, please contact Manchester Township directly to report.

Light Bulk Trash

Crestwood Village 1 offers a free pickup of your bulk trash on the last Wednesday of every month. This free pickup is intended to provide residents with a means to dispose of a FEW larger items, not picked up by the normal household trash pickups. It is suggested you have these items out the night before, as Maintenance begins early on these pickup days and will not be able to return to a property once their pickups are complete. A free inhouse pickup will also be offered the last Wednesday of the month for a FEW item this is not intended to clean out an entire unit. Please call the Maintenance Department to schedule a pickup of your bulk trash.

In-House Pickups

The Maintenance Department can be contacted to assist in the removal of items too large for residents. This is a chargeable work order and is dependent upon the amount of stuff to be removed from the unit. Contact the Maintenance Department to request current pricing and schedules.

Whole House Clean-outs

The Maintenance Department can be contacted to assist in cleaning out an entire unit if needed. This is a chargeable work order and is dependent upon the amount of stuff to be removed from the unit. Contact the Maintenance Department to request current pricing and schedules.

Moving Boxes

Crestwood Village 1 will remove, for free, any moving boxes for new residents. Please break down the boxes and stack in an orderly fashion, then call the Maintenance Department and we will remove the boxes for you. This service is only provided once to new residents. If there are ever any questions or concerns please contact the Village 1 Maintenance Department.
