**Happy November to all!** I would like to start by welcoming Jim Maloney. He will be working alongside Carl to prepare for the position of Treasurer. He worked in the banking industry and construction. He has plenty of experience with finances, budgeting, capital reserves along with building codes and regulations. We believe he will be a true asset to the Board of Trustees.

Power washing is still in effect. We ask for cooperation with our Contractor. Please remove plants, chairs, or anything that may be damaged before they start on your unit.

We are still waiting for the HOPA's (housing for older people act) to be returned to the Trustees office. While we have had great cooperation on this, we are still waiting on approximately 200 of our 1016 residents to return these to the office. This is important if we were to have an audit. If you are one of the 200, please complete and return this form.

On November 11<sup>th</sup> (Veterans day), we will be having a small parade on the Clubhouse side of the Village. We will be closing the roads for a short time while the beautiful horses march. This will kick off at the Clubhouse at 1pm.

I would like to remind everyone about some of our Rules. No structural changes including door replacements are allowed without permission from the Trustees office. A work request form must be completed. All doors MUST be white. We have a short list of doors that are not white. We will not force them to be painted BUT if replaced, they must be white. We do not allow any vehicle repairs on our property, you will be fined. Please keep your dogs leashed. Do not allow them to relieve themselves on garbage cans and pick up after them and BRING HOME to your garbage. You have 3' to maintain around the outside of your unit. Anything on common grounds must be approved by the Board of Trustees. No planting or removing plants, bushes or trees without permission. Nothing should interfere with lawn mowing and edging. In most cases, we will allow a 12' x 15' concrete slab or 3 season room with Board approval.

We are in the process of updating our Rules and Regulations and you will all receive a complete set with your newsletter hopefully for December.







On Friday, October 15, 2021, the Whiting Drop Box for tax and water payments will be removed from the Whiting Town Center shopping plaza and relocated to the Manchester Township Emergency Services (formerly known as 'Whiting First Aid') building at 82 Lacey Road in Whiting.

### **Manchester Coordinating Council**

### Monday, September 27, 2021 – Manchester Coordinating Council meeting minutes recap.

Councilman Jim Vacarro and Sam Fusaro shared information. The new building on the corner of Schoolhouse and 530 was discussed. There will be 2 entrances to this Dollar General, deliveries will be done in the evening. management states the employee parking area will be cleared when the deliveries occur if necessary. Dollar Tree in Whiting shelves is empty a lot. Other Dollar Tree shelves are not. Ron Paluzzi spoke to management about why this is happening. The stores state their problem is shipping coming in because of COVID 19, also some products are from China.

Regarding the Properties where Dollar General is now Manchester Blvd and 530, no applicant has come through yet. We need new businesses in the area.

Sam and Jim are on the Master Plan Sub Committee and have written to Cracker Barrel, Chick Filet, Aldi, Lidl. We have the community support and are continuing to pursue options. A member has been communicating with Lidl and Aldi for support in coming to our area. The township provided that if you go into an old store, taxes will be taken care of as an incentive for a year or two. Warehouse on 539 discussed. It has been approved, Lennar came to the zoning board meeting requesting a change in this application. The applicant has modified that there will be no customers, no foot traffic. Low-density site as a contractor supply warehouse.

Whiting Center discussed. Lennar came to the township proposing to buy and restore the old shopping center. Add homes for vets around the area and some apartments.

Heritage Mineral area has applied for a re-development. Brought several proposals in but none have been approved yet. They did put the water in and re-paved all of route 70.

Our population and income changing in this area, many new residents work.

Companies are having a hard time getting bus drivers and truck drivers.

Public Service announcement from the League of Woman voters has plugged into a national website <u>vote411.org</u>. You can look up a candidate and find information.

### Hello Residents of Village 1,

### Total Work Orders (past 30 days) = 321

I hope everyone is continuing to be safe and healthy with the world as it is. Just as a reminder, the Maintenance Office doors will continue to be closed to the general public to minimize any potential cross contamination and to ensure we can continue to operate with our full staff. As always, you can call (732-350-2202), email (crestwood1maintenance@gmail.com), drop a letter in the mailboxes located outside the Friendship Hall Clubhouse or next to the front door of the Maintenance Building for work-related requests. Please be masked and allow the Maintenance Technicians to complete their work while maintaining a safe distance while we are addressing your work orders. We do appreciate your cooperation!

Materials continue to be difficult to acquire for many projects, as well as the overall cost of these same materials remaining at all time highs. We are continuing our work, but please be aware that delays are occurring, which are generally out of our control.

During the past few months, while completing Resale Inspections for units, we have come across many interior alterations which did not follow the expected protocol of Village 1. These alterations, although they may update and improve the overall look of the interior, can have a detrimental effect to the structure and could potentially cause delays when a resident is looking to sell their unit. Delays would be caused by residents having to acquire the correct permits, complete any and all Township related inspections, and receiving approval. There are instances where residents have had to revert the new alterations back to the original condition. This is something that can be avoided, by making sure you are completing a Permission Request Form or at least making a call to see if your proposed alterations need additional permits and/or inspections. At a minimum, the Crestwood Village 1 Co-op or Maintenance should be contacted to find out additional information and to make us aware.

An example of these alterations includes the installation of large soaker tubs, also known as wheelchair accessible bathtubs. These typically require upgraded electrical or sub-panels to accommodate the bathtubs and are rarely ever properly permitted or inspected by Manchester Township. Another issue with these large bathtubs is the amount of weight of the bathtub itself, especially when full (approximately 45 gallons) can weigh between 350 - 500 pounds! Add a person to that and we are looking at an additional 100 - 200 pounds of weight. These buildings, when constructed, were never intended to support this kind of weight in an isolated area. Additionally, these large soaker tubs require an upgraded hot water heater (usually 80 gallons) and besides adding more weight, these need to be permitted and approved by Manchester Township. These are typically not approved for installation for the reasons mentioned above, but each request will be reviewed upon its receipt. Other examples include removal of walls, changes to the existing footprint of the building, installation of a central air conditioning system, or the addition of new electrical or plumbing fixtures.

These are just some examples of many similar issues that we come across on a regular basis. Please make a call to see if any of your interior alterations are required to be permitted by either the Crestwood Village 1 Co-op or Manchester Township. We also require residents to supply Permission Request Forms for exterior work as well. These tasks include but are not limited too, installation of a satellite dish, planting of trees/shrubs, entry doors, or any significant alterations to the exterior.

One more note, as many of you, know this ongoing pandemic is affecting lots of us directly at this time. We recently lost an amazing individual, both personally and professionally due to complications from COVID. A good friend and Stanley Contracting colleague, Carl Costantino will be greatly missed and not forgotten. My condolences to all who are dealing with issues related to this COVID disaster and I wish all good health and good luck in the ongoing battle.

Social Security Announces Redesign Statement – Now Available with a *my* Social Security Account

Kilolo Kijakazi, Acting Commissioner of Social Security, today introduced a new look and feel to the *Social Security Statement*, available online through the **my Social Security** portal at www.socialsecurity.gov/myaccount and by mail. The *Statement* is one of the most effective tools people can use to learn about their earnings and future Social Security benefits. This fresh look will allow millions of people to see their earnings information and estimates of future benefits quickly and securely.

The agency conducted extensive research, review, and testing to make the updated

Statement easy to understand. The new Statement is shorter, uses visuals and plain language, and includes fact sheets tailored to a person's age and earnings history. It also includes important information people have come to expect from the Statement, such as how much a worker and family members could expect to receive in Social Security benefits and a personalized earnings history, in a clear, concise manner. Examples of the new Statement and fact sheets are available at www.socialsecurity.gov/myaccount/statement.html.

People can check information and conduct most Social Security business through

their personal **my Social Security** account. If they already receive Social Security benefits, they can start or change direct deposit online, request a replacement SSA-1099, and if they need proof of their benefits, they can print or download a current Benefit Verification Letter from their account.

Many Social Security services are also conveniently available by dialing toll-free, **1-800-772-1213**. People who are deaf or hard of hearing may call Social Security's TTY number, **1-800-325-0778**.
