I would also like to remind you that with the cold weather approaching, it is in your best interest to have an updated spare key in our Maintenance Department. It remains in a locked and secured cabinet but can mean the difference if you should become locked out. During regular work hours, there would be no charge to unlock your door, however, if we need to replace your lock you would incur a fee that would be between \$25.00 to \$30.00. After hours and on the weekends, it would be a \$60.00 call-out fee along with the replacement door lock if we do not have the correct key.

With the colder weather comes the risks of having fires due to the heaters being blocked or curtains laying on them. Please take proper precautions to ensure the wall heaters are clear of any and all materials.

THE MANCHESTER COORDINATING COUNCIL MEETING

MCC monthly meeting was held at Village 5 Club House October 25, 2021 at 1:30 PM.

Manchester Township Senior Services Dept is collecting for their annual Thanksgiving program where they give \$75.00 to qualified families. Last year they gifted gift cards to 256 families.

Featured guest speakers were from the Ocean County Board of Health. A lengthy discussion was given on what resources are available and offered. Live Healthy services include BP screening, Stroke Risk Assessment, Health Education and Glucose/Cholesterol Testing. A detailed description was given on why its important to get vaccinated and the options available for COVID immunization along with details regarding flu vaccine, shingles, pneumoccoccal vaccine and Tdap. Holiday Images

It's time to prepare for the holidays - Christmas, Hanukkah, and New Years. The main subjects are family and friends. I run this article every December because I think this is a good time for a review.

This time of year we often see relatives and loved ones that we haven't seen for a while. We want to capture the festive atmosphere and good time that everyone is enjoying. What can we do to make these images look relaxed and more professional?

For candid shots make certain you're prepared -- have your camera ready and watch the subject for the expression you want. If you aren't ready the shot will be gone before you press the shutter. Most holiday shots will be taken indoors so don't forget to use your camera's flash.

For portraits and group shots get yourself set up first, and then prepare your subject. If you keep them waiting you will not get a natural relaxed image. For individual portraits choose a background that's festive,

but not too busy. Have your subject(s) turn their shoulders slightly so they are not too square to the camera.

When photographing grandchildren or pets try to get eye level with them, rather than shooting down at them.

I also like to photograph the festive holiday decorations. These often make fun shots and can be used on your holiday cards next year.

Don't forget the rule of



thirds (also from a previous photo tip). Rather than placing your subjects in front of the Christmas tree, move them slightly to one side. If shooting the dinner table set for the holiday feast, have the host stand at one side of the table about 1/3 of the way from the end, rather than centered at the end of the table.

These techniques will help improve your images holiday images. Have a great holiday season, a happy and healthy New Year and remember to have fun with your camera.

Hello Residents of Village 1,

Total Work Orders (past 30 days) = 414

I was taking a look back and realized that around this time last year, we encountered our first bit of snow. Figured this is as good a time as ever to discuss our guidelines for when the white stuff starts falling and how Crestwood Village 1 manages the work associated with plowing and snow removal. The procedure and information provided below comes directly from the Board of Trustees. The biggest thing we can request is that all residents stay inside when the street and driveway clearing is underway and to please, please exercise patience and understanding during these times.

Special consideration for priority clearing will only be arranged for medical appointments and outpatient treatments. You are required to provide the Trustees Office a copy of your doctor's name, phone number and time of appointment on your respective doctor's letterhead. This must be provided in advance, we will not be able to accommodate calls made the morning of a snow storm. After verifying the information provided, the Board of Trustees will authorize and prioritize the clearing of these units. The Board of Trustees will not make special arrangements for those that are employed, it will not entitle you to priority snow clearing. Please do not call the Maintenance Department to request individual attention, the only people that can authorize priority snow plowing are the Trustees.

- Roads will not be plowed until there is 3" of snow accumulation;
- When icy conditions are observed, ice melt will be applied to the roads;
- NO on-street parking for impending snow storms, you will be assessed a \$50 fine and parking on the grass is not acceptable. If you do leave your vehicle on the road during plowing activities, you will be plowed in. If you require assistance to clear your vehicle out, you will be assessed a minimum \$60 charge for this service;
- Residents are not to push, shovel, blow or deposit snow onto village roadways;
- When the roadways are made passable, the Maintenance Department will begin to clear driveways and sidewalks;
- Duplex driveways will be cleared and treated as sidewalks;
- Quad driveways will be cleared by pushing the snow forward or to side when available, depending on the position of the unit;
- Sidewalks will be cleared as soon as possible, depending on man-power available;
- Keep a bag of Ice Melt on hand for your steps and sidewalk area;
- The Maintenance Department is working on securing 10 pound bags of ice melt, from what we have been told, there is very little inventory;
- THERE WILL BE NO DEVIATION FROM OUR SNOW REMOVAL PROGRAM.
