Trustees Notes...

I hope everyone is well. We have had some beautiful, sunny crisp mornings followed by pleasant afternoons. A good time to get some fresh air!

The Trustees office had our Representatives deliver to you some letters to our State Senator and Assemblymen asking for you to sign the letters and return to their office. Thank you to all who participated. I would like to take some time to try to explain a little more about these bills that we object to.

Our State Senator Holzapfel and Assemblymen McGuckin and Catalano ARE opposed to this bill. They are working to push their opposition on those in favor.

Carol Murphy (district 7) proposed Assembly Bill A4377. This Bill if passed would impose an annual tax on all Co-op's. This will require non delinquent unit owners to subsidize the delinquent unit owners by mandating an annual payment to a "Common Interest Community Homeowners Association Trust Fund" to pay for low income households AND fund the Department of Community Affairs (DCA). This will escalate the cost of living for us and create a bloated bureaucracy within the DCA. The DCA will have the right to assist in forming new Rules and Regulations. This will be done by people in Trenton who do not live here and don't understand how we operate.

Senate Bill S2537 proposed by Troy Singleton (district 7) and the companion Assembly Bill A4106 proposed by Yvonne Lopez (district 19) & Angelica Jiminez (district 32) in essence, seeks to override the governing documents of the Village. This would allow corporations, businesses and under aged persons to buy in our Village and rent them out. This would also allow corporations or a young person to serve on the Board and we know they do not have the same interests that we do.

Our Village, along with all the communities in our area have run for 50+ years successfully. We see these bills causing nothing but problems within our Village. We feel if a Community Association is not happy with their operations or their Bylaws, that particular Community can make changes as they see fit. We don't need more Government interference or more monthly expenses being paid out of our wallets. We ask everyone to get involved. Look up these Bills online. Contact these Assemblywomen and State Senator and voice your opposition. We feel with these bills, only Real Estate Brokers will benefit with more money in their pockets and less in ours.

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Hello Residents of Village 1,

Hopefully, I am really early when it comes to mentioning this, but with the conflicting weather reports I would like to discuss our guidelines for snow removal. The information provided below comes directly from the Board of Trustees. The biggest thing we can request is that all residents stay inside when the street and driveway clearing is underway and to please exercise patience and understanding during these times. Special consideration for priority snow removal will only be arranged for medical appointments and outpatient treatments. You are required to provide the Trustee's Office a copy of your doctor's name, phone number and time of your appointment on your respective doctor's letterhead. This must be provided in advance, we will not be able to accommodate calls made the morning of a snow storm. After verifying the information provided, the Board of Trustees and the Trustees Office will prioritize the clearing of these units. The Board of Trustees will not make special arrangements for those that are employed, it will not entitle you to priority snow removal. Please do not call the Maintenance Department to request individual attention, the only ones that can authorize priority snow plowing are the Trustees.

- Roads will not be plowed until there is 3" of snow accumulation;
- When icy conditions are present, ice melt will be applied to the roads;
- NO on-street parking is allowed for impending snow, you will be assessed a \$50 fine and parking on the grass is not acceptable. If you do leave your vehicle on the grass or road during plowing activities, you will be plowed in. If you require assistance to get your vehicle out, you will be charged a minimum of \$60 for the service and will not be addressed until all other snow clearing activities are completed;
- Residents are not to push, shovel, blow or deposit snow onto Village roadways;
- When the roads are made passable, the Maintenance Department will begin to clear driveways, then followed by sidewalks;
- Duplex driveways will be cleared and treated as sidewalks, as you do have secondary means to exit and enter through your garage door;
- Quad driveways will be cleared by pushing the snow forward towards the buildings or to the side when available, depending on the positioning of your building;
- Sidewalks will be cleared as soon as possible, depending on the man-power that is available;
- Keep a bag or two of ice melt on hand for your steps and sidewalk area (available through the Maintenance Department, call for pricing and for delivery);
- THERE WILL BE NO DEVIATION FROM OUR SNOW REMOVAL PROGRAM.

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THE MANCHESTER COORDINATING COUNCIL MEETING

MCC Guest : Ronald T. Catelli ESQ September 26, 2022

Everyone is concerned about the new legislation \$2537. There is a nitch under the fair housing act which allows discrimination based on age. In any other situation, you are not permitted to discriminate. There is a carve-out in the fair housing act called HOPA Housing for Older Person Act, it's a federal legislation and essentially it says you are allowed to discriminate based on age providing that at least 80% of your community is over the age of 55. The federal statute reads you are allowed to discriminate over 55 only; as long as 80% of the units in your community are occupied by someone over the age of 55. Occupied not ownership of the particular units. What NJ legislation is attempting to do is say you are NOT allowed to prohibit ownership in a senior community to those under 55. This bill applies to any type of community association. You cannot prohibit ownership. A tremendous concern to senior communities. This legislation is flying under the radar. Introduced by Senator Troy Singleton, from District 7 in NJ. May 2022. It is sitting in the senate community and urban affairs committee right now. The group that would profit or be on board with this would be realtors. The only group that he has heard of with these restrictions and challenges is realtors. It waters down the rights of a senior community. Allowing ownership in a senior community that is geared towards seniors, and allow those under 55 to purchase, their interest is not the same as a senior. Someone 25 years old does not have the same interests and objectives as a 55-year-old. Radburn and PREFTA say the only eligibility to run for a board position requirement is to be in good standing. So they could be 25 years old and run on the board. If you are current in monthly fees, or on time in a payment plan you are in good standing with the DCA (Department of Community Affairs). This bill is only addressing ownership of the units.

Another Bill is **A4377.** This bill is almost slipping through the radar also. Legislature has given the DCA (Department of Community Affairs) a lot of authority. This Bill enhances DCA regulatory powers over controlled boards within the interest of the communities. DCA is expanding. Use the same template to oppose.

The next 2 bills **A1698** and **A1699** require an educational component for trustees once they become in office.


