Just a couple of things we would like to remind everyone. Propane grills are permitted in the Village. When grilling, they must be kept 10 feet away from the building. CHARCOAL GRILLS ARE NOT PERMITTED. Our Rules state no open flames which does include charcoal grills. This is for the safety of everyone. One fire costs everyone.

When doing any trimming of trees or shrubs, please do not drag into the woods. We offer a free weekly pick up every Thursday for branches and brush. We ask you keep by your building until Wednesday night, then drag out to the street for early morning pick up. Please don't clutter the woods with this debris.

We have kicked off our "Save the Lake" event. Volunteers are working hard to clean up behind the clubhouse, lake and picnic area. This project will make our Village even more desirable. We already have the picnic area and beautiful grill for your use. Cleaning up the lake shore will make it so much better. If you can spare any time, let us know and find out where you can help.

### MANCHESTER COORDINATING COUNCIL

### MCC monthly meeting was held at Village 5 clubhouse on April 24, 2023, at 1:30PM.

Steven E. Yergeau, Ph.D from Rutgers Cooperative Extension was introduced. Rutgers Cooperative Extension helps local communities adapt to a rapidly changing society through education. He explained what a watershed is which is an area of land that water flows across, through, or under. It is like a big bathtub They collect water, store and release water. The Barnegat Bay watershed has about 9.2 impervious cover (2015). Every 4 years this observation is complete, last time was 2019 and the numbers did not change too much. Runoff is excess of water flowing over the ground surface and returning to lakes and streams. County boards of health monitor bathing beaches. NJDEP conducts monitoring and regulates shellfish harvest areas. Hard clams grow best in water temperature of 68 degrees, with Salinity between 20 ppt and 30 ppt, High Turbidity levels can clog hard clam filter-feeding apparatus and cause starvation. 8 steps to a Jersey-Friendly Landscape are plan, start with healthy soil, water wisley, fertilize less, manage pests responsibly, reduce lawn size, create wildlife habitat, and recycle in your yard. Over 82% of trash collected by Clean Ocean Action NJ in 2021 was some sort of plastic. We have to all find a way to get multiple uses out of a single-use plastic item, for example plastic water bottles.

Manchester Office of Emergency Management (OEM) Sgt Robert Sharry Emergency Management Coordinator Manchester Twp Police and Brian M. Ruditsky Deputy Coordinator Manchester Twp. Emergency Management were introduced. What they do is coordinate between all Emergency agencies. Fire, First-aid, police, state, county, federal, and civilian. Nixle is a commercial public safety service. Community Engagement and Emergency Management together. The messages are area specific to ensure the affected vicinity is targeted. OEM has control to ensure the messages are reaching the appropriate target. Visit <a href="http://www.nixle.com">http://www.nixle.com</a>. Register your cell phone that gives you blanket coverage.

When you are sheltering, your pets are allowed to go with you, they have a supply of animal crates. If your animal is vicious, tell the persons at the shelter and they will help with accommodations for your pet. People ask what evacuation routes we have - the emergency going on at the time affects the evacuation route at that time. OEM discussed the fire that occurred a couple of weeks ago. This was a 4000-acre forest fire.

170 homes were evacuated and a horse farm. Minor damage to a boat and a fence with a glitch or two at the horse farm, with no injuries. OEM is always working and planning with tabletop exercises which are mock drills to ensure they are always doing their best. Forest fires are the biggest threat in our area. The Nixle system will go to your

cell, landline, or email. If you have neighbors that are old school work with them and share the emergency information. There is a yellow dot program for your car that was discussed which is provided by social services. Sergeant also discussed the File of Life which is a sticker for your front door and refrigerator sticker with your medical information enclosed.

Comcast is negotiating their contract - the application is at town hall and can be reviewed at Manchester town hall on weekdays from 8:30-4PM.

I don't know about you, but I cannot believe that we are almost through May and heading into June! Time flies when you are having fun! This month I would like to touch on some of the Spring related tasks and the expectations set forth by the Board of Trustees when performing Spring cleanups and other tasks.

### **Lawn Service**

We have a general idea of when the mowers are coming, but inclement weather does affect their schedule quite a bit. It is important that you keep yards clean and mostly clear so they can efficiently perform the service they provide. If you have hired a separate lawn service to do your yards, then it is imperative that you place "DO NOT MOW" flags around the property, so the Village lawn service knows to skip your property. If you notice any damage or have any questions or concerns please contact the Maintenance Department so that we can investigate the claim and contact the appropriate people.

### Trees/Shrubs

If you have a concern about trees around your building, please call/email/write a letter requesting an inspection of the tree(s). The Maintenance Department will come out to see if the tree(s) meet the Village's requirements for removal. If you are requesting the trimming of shrubs on the property, this is a chargeable request. Again, please call/email/write with your request and we will inspect to provide a cost for trimming or removal.

### **Sheds**

The Village does allow residents to purchase storage sheds for the property. There is a specific size that residents must adhere to and a permission request form is required for sheds.

### **Spigots**

If you are looking to water around your units with your outside spigot and you notice there is no water or a reduced water flow, please contact the Maintenance Department. There is a possibility that the piping associated with the spigot suffered a failure or simply the water was turned off at the end of last season and just needs to be turned back on. If you do notice issues with the spigot, please do not continue to use as additional damages might occur. The Maintenance Department is replacing spigots, which are now 100% chargeable to you the resident, please call for current pricing.

### Dogs

Please clean up after your dog. Please dispose in the appropriate container at your unit. Unattended dogs and dogs on outside leads are not allowed. I see plenty of residents who have posted signs on the lawns regarding people cleaning up after their dogs, which means to me that people are not cleaning up after them.

### **Save the Lake Project**

The Village has begun a project by the Clubhouse in which a resident-led team will be improving this area for the enjoyment of residents. There are several projects on-going and in the works and if you are interested in pitching in, you should contact the Trustees Office for more information. From what I've heard, they have some big plans and should really benefit the Village as a whole.

We will be using the RoboCall system to announce group work dates, but feel free to attend any day you can devote a few hours.







### Backyard Griffiers

You can get great shots without going away on a photography vacations. There are many thing to shoot around your home and our state. I enjoy sitting in the back yard, or shooting out a window, to capture some of the wildlife in my yard.

Like any other wildlife photography your two main weapons are patience and knowing your subject. A long lens is also helpful, but not a must.

There's no substitute for patience. Sitting quietly waiting for a good shot is the most important part of shooting animals. A comfortable seat or cushion can make your wait more pleasant. The closer you are to animals the more nervous they get, so you must sit very still. Move very slowly and as little as possible to lessen the chances of scaring your subject.

By knowing your subject's habits you can predict its movements and greatly increase your chance of getting a good shot. Using food to lure your subjects within range is very helpful, especially in backyard shots where the animals are used to seeing people. Playing bird calls on your iPod or stereo will attract birds closer to give you a good shot.
