MANCHESTER COORDINATING COUNCIL

MCC monthly meeting was held on June 26, 2023, at Village 5 clubhouse, Schoolhouse Rd., Whiting NJ.

Guest speaker Susan Emhardt-Servidio a horticulturist and a Rutgers Masters Gardener Coordinator for Ocean County was introduced.

Volunteers are trained with gardening knowledge, botany, and science to help troubleshoot in the garden. Services in the office in Toms River are tick ID, soil testing, and a telephone helpline to ask gardening questions. Also, 4 H groups. 2 professors are also involved, an agricultural professor and a marine agent professor doing research on the wind fans and how fish are reacting. There is no easy solution when it comes to deer. Try to plant what the deer don't like. Last year they were eating anything for moisture during drought season. The babies do not have a preference, they eat everything. Strong-scented perennials like salvia, sages, and furry or hairy plants they tend to leave alone. Sonic tends not to be effective, deer sprays can be applied topically. Strong-smelling things rotated are the best for spraying. Don't use the same spray scent all the time, they get used to it. Deer netting on your vegetables may help. Not all ticks carry Lyme disease but all ticks have the potential to carry a disease. They will identify a tick, test your soil, and they hold events of interest to butterfly lovers and gardeners. You can take a picture of an unknown plant and send it to them, and they will identify it for you. Invasive plants such as Barberry, a red-leafed plant with thorns, that keeps its color, the birds eat the seeds and drop them everywhere. It is taking over our natural forests. There is a press release regarding the spotted lantern fly, it's not as dangerous to our trees as they first thought. We will do an intervention before it becomes more of an issue They have their favorites like maple trees, grape vines, roses, and fig trees. Right now they are in their hopping stage. They hop forward. They don't bite us but they eat the sap of the flower or tree. Irish Spring soap has a very strong scent that deer don't like, also dryer fluffs. the scent you choose has to be every 3 feet. A plants purpose is to grow, flower, make seed and die. Deadheading for annuals is a way to keep your flower growing. Certain perennials like sage, salvia, and catmint - cut it down with a nice haircut and it will grow right back in full swing.

Village 5 is offering non-certification CPR and First Aid classes on First Saturday monthly. They are also offering Technology workshops every Second Saturday. 10-person limit per class. Please call to reserve your spot at 732-350-0700.

It was stressed to the group the importance of attending Zoning, Council, and Planning board meetings held monthly at Manchester town hall.

It was brought up in an article in the paper about the taxes raising in Manchester. Jim Vicarro responded. We inherited a 1.5 million dollar cash flow problem shortage. Mayor Arace was innovative with our CFO to carve up with 3.8 % increase. Next year will be substantially less. We will feel relief next year.

A letter to Governor Phil Murphy from Joseph H. Vicari Director, Ocean County Board of Commissioners was read. The letter referred to a growing problem facing our older adults - the cost of housing. In Joseph's opinion, the state is in desperate need of affordable housing for senior citizens. Funding needs to be made available for rental and housing assistance so our older adults do not have to worry about having a roof over their heads. He feels the solution is going to require innovative thinking and cooperation between state county and municipal governments.

The MCC is off the summer and will hold our next meeting on Monday, September 25th. Superintendent of Schools Dr. John Berenato will be our guest.

The meeting adjourned at 2:30PM.

Dogs

Personally, it's always nice to see so many residents out walking their dogs. However, I do not like to see how people dispose of their dog's waste in a lot of cases...if they do clean it up at all. There are public garbage cans located around the Village, people should not be utilizing the in-ground personal garbage cans as they seem fit. The Maintenance Department should not have to receive and address calls regarding stray dog waste bags in their garbage cans. Please take your bags back to your unit to dispose of it properly.

Leaving your dog(s) outside, unattended is not permitted. Additionally, you are required to clean up any dog waste around your property. Too often there are literal mine fields around the buildings which is considered common ground and the Maintenance Department, residents or guests should not have to be concerned while walking through these areas.

Your dog(s) must be leashed at all times.

If you are observed not cleaning up after your dog, improperly disposing of waste bags, unleashed dog(s) or allowing your dog(s) to roam around outside unattended, you can expect a letter and potential fines from the Board of Trustees.

Air Conditioning

Easiest way to battle the heat is to stay inside and enjoy your air conditioning! Maintaining your air conditioning is the responsibility of the residents. Basic service of your air conditioning does not require permission request forms and is recommended to keep your units running efficiently. Window units are not permitted anywhere in Village 1, that includes in the windows or through the walls which is a common thing we see around the Village. These window air conditioning units have slots which are vented out the sides and the top of the unit, which will create issues in the wall cavities. Besides the vented heat, there is a chance the condensation can back up and cause structural issues to the building. If you have an improperly

sized unit in the larger cut outs on the sides of the building, stuffing it full of stuff to stop drafts is not a good idea. When your unit eventually comes up for sale and an inspection is completed, you should be prepared to pay for removal and replacement of the existing undersized, wrong style air conditioning units...as well as, any associated damage from the improper wall units. Central air conditioning units are to have their associated condensation lines to deposit on the exterior of the buildings and not in the crawlspaces. If this is discovered at your unit, you will be required to correct the condensation and to pay for any cleanup of residual liquid or damage resulting from this improper installation.

Portable (floor) air conditioning units are acceptable, as long as they are properly vented to the exterior of the building.

Contact the Maintenance Department if you are considering swapping an existing air conditioning unit or are looking to install a new one and we can certainly point in the direction of having a proper unit installed properly.

Grills

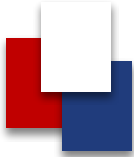
Doing some outdoor grilling goes hand in hand with the summer time. It is important that you keep the grills a minimum of 10 feet from the buildings. If you are a propane user, Village 1 does not want to see spare propane cans (empty or full) around the exterior of the buildings. Charcoal grills are not permitted.

If you need extra storage, Village 1 does allow residents to purchase a shed for extra storage. There are regulations to the size and shape of the sheds, please contact the Maintenance Department for information.

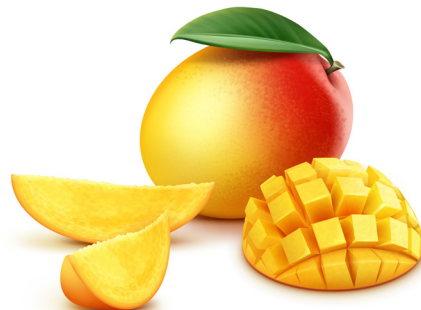
Ingredients

HOPA Survey (Housing for Older People Act)

The HOPA provides housing for older persons and is intended for occupancy by at least one person 55 years of age or older per unit. It requires that periodically information must be collected and verified with the age of all residents. If a survey is not completed, the senior housing community could lose its housing status.

It is mandatory that this survey be completed and filed with the Co-Op office.

We are looking forward to resuming our monthly meetings.

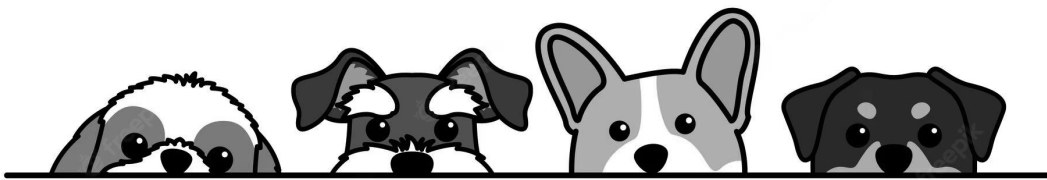
