Do not put ticks on tape. Ticks should be in a sealed container/plastic bag with a small piece of moist paper towel. (After hours a drop box is available for tick submission in a sealed baggie with name, address, and telephone number)

#### Tick Safety Information from Rutgers University, New Jersey Dept. of Health and the CDC

#### When are ticks active and how do tick-borne diseases spread?

Ticks could be active year round with peak times listed below.

Tick-borne diseases are not spread between two people, but rather rely on ticks for transmission.

#### What are the symptoms of tick-borne diseases?

Early signs of tick-borne diseases generally include:

Skin rash, general tiredness, fever, chills, headache, stiff neck, muscle aches, joint pain, and/or dizziness.

#### How are tick-borne diseases diagnosed?

It is important to watch for symptoms, talk to your healthcare provider and be sure to let them know you had a tick bite. If you've been bitten by a tick, early treatment can be very effective.

#### How can tick-borne diseases be prevented?


Anyone who is bitten by an infected tick may get a tick-borne disease. Helpful hints include:

- Take extra precautions in the summer when ticks that transmit diseases are most active
- When outdoors, apply EPA-registered insect repellent on exposed skin and clothing according to the instructions on the product label. DEET, picardin, and oil of Lemon Eucalyptus may be used on skin. Permethrin should only be used on clothing and outdoor gear
- Cover up; wear long, solid and light colored clothing with pants tucked into socks. Perform tick checks
- Safely remove any found ticks

#### MINUTE

Hello, Residents of Village 1!

#### Work Orders Completed (past 30 days) = 265

Recently, we have seen an increase in residents utilizing state-funded utility assistance programs to help in getting some projects and work completed at their units. These state-funded energy companies typically are working for people that are considered lower income and require residents to apply to see if they qualify. These companies provide an amazing service and the process from beginning to end can take several weeks from application to work being completed. The Crestwood Village 1 Co-op (Co-op) understands the financial hardships that affects everyone differently and therefore does allow residents to apply at their own discretion.

The only issue so far that the Co-op has with these programs and this type of work is the absolute lack of notification provided to the Co-op by these companies or the residents. More times than not, the Co-op has absolutely no idea of any work being done in Village 1 until the companies are at the unit performing the work. Just like any other subcontracted work, if notification was not provided and approval is not granted, the job can be shut down for rescheduling at a later date. Contrary to what is being told to the residents by these companies providing the service, they absolutely DO NOT have the authority to do what they want, when they want. These buildings and individual units are still the property of the Co-op and therefore are entitled to know what is being done and when. As many of you know, these buildings are around 60 years old, and sometimes the good you did in one location of the building can have a negative effect somewhere else. Since notifications are in general not being provided, the Co-op does not have the ability to track what repairs are being completed and if the work being completed is being done properly by completing follow-up inspections.

Plain and simple, any work that you are planning on completing with the use of a subcontractor, requires notification to the Trustees Office prior. Fill out a Permission Request Form and get it submitted or place a call to the **Trustees Office (732) 350-1818** or the **Maintenance Office (732) 350-2202** to see if any additional information is required.

- 1/4 tsp baking soda + 1/2 tsp cream of tartar
- 1 cup of shortening or 7/8 cup vegetable oil
- 2 tsp vinegar or lemon juice
- 1 1/4 cup white sugar plus 1/3 cup water
- 1 TB lemon juice or vinegar + 1 cup of milk
- 1/4 cup egg substitute or 1/4 cup silken tofu
- 1 cup brow sugar or 1 1/4 cup confectioners sugar
- 1 cup sour cream or 1 cup buttermilk
- 1/2 tsp cinnamon, 1/4 ginger & 1/4 tsp cloves
- 1 TB flour or 1 tsp cornstarch
- 1 ounce square unsweetened chocolate
- 1 1/4 cup white sugar + 1/3 cup water or 1 cup honey
- 7/8 cup milk + 1 TB butter
- 1 cup sour cream or 1 cup plain yogurt

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#### Slow Cooker Buffalo Chicken Dip

This Slow Cooker Buffalo Chicken Dip is made with rotisserie chicken, ranch dressing, cream cheese, cheddar, and buffalo sauce for a creamy game-day dip. We love serving this dip the entire football season.

#### Ingredients:

- 1 rotisserie chicken, cut and chop chicken, discard bones and skin
- 12 oz. Franks Red Hot Buffalo Sauce
- 16 oz. Hidden Valley Ranch Dressing
- 8 oz. cream cheese
- 2 cups shredded cheese, I use Sargento 4 cheese blend
- green onions for topping the dip

#### Instructions:

- 1. Add the chicken, hot sauce, ranch, cream cheese and cheddar. Stir.
- 2. Cover and cook for 2 hours on high. Stir 1-2 times during the cooking time, the cheese tends to stick to the edges.
- 3. Top the dip with green onions if desired.
- 4. Serve with desired dippers and enjoy!
- 5. Switch the slow cooker to warm for your party, keep an eye on it for it still can scorch on warm. Stir often.

#### **Baking Instructions:**

Place in a preheated 350 degree oven and bake uncovered for 30 mins.
