MANCHESTER COORDINATING COUNCIL

Manchester Coordinating Council meeting was held on September 25, 2023

Guest speaker Superintendent of Schools of Manchester John Berenato was introduced. He feels connections that the school had with the communities were disrupted during COVID. They want the schools to be a hub for the community. Seniors can become a volunteer. They are always looking to be able to pair their students up with a mentor; contact: <u>volunteer@mtschools.org</u>. Students would like to interact with the community by helping with things we may need help with. One thing the students have been doing is technology assistance to the seniors. If your community is interested in having students come to visit contact <u>dsilvestri@mtschools.org</u>. Manchester Twp School District last year was awarded almost 3.4 million dollars to launch their Universal Pre-school Program. It's a longstanding initiative that they have been trying to get off the ground for NJ. Presently we have 15 general education preschool classrooms to service 3 and 4 year olds. In addition, we have 3 preschool special education classrooms. This program is zero cost to taxpayers. Technology Safety and Security initiatives were updated and the Visitor management system is now in place when anyone is visiting the schools.

A question regarding CRT came up. Critical Race Theory is not used in our schools. From the onset, CRT was established in the 1960s and 70s through pre-lawyers, it had to do with several incarcerated African Americans and how they saw the rates increase. It was meant for attorneys to be mindful when they were representing clients. CRT has not made its way to Pre-K through 12. There is no place for CRT in our schools.

Judy Noonan MCC Legislative Chairwoman Assistant to Mayor Arace was introduced. The Governor approved that Cranberry Juice is now our state beverage. Judy will be submitting information to all the associations regarding Manchester Senior's Thanksgiving holiday meals. The registration forms will be available at your clubhouse and must be submitted by October 15th. Meals are made by the culinary school, after pre-registered, meals can be picked up at the Barn and the Firehouse.

Need help learning computer or cell phone technology? On November 1 Village 6 clubhouse is having a class from 11am-1pm. Classes taught by Manchester high school students. You must sign up at the clubhouse lobby and/or Village 6 office.

Specifications, Permits, and explanations regarding Electric car charging stations were gathered by Judy. She is sharing this information with each association.

In the new year Judy will have a class run by an attorney explaining the Radbun Act, how does a board work, how does management work with your board.

The On Point program is a new program, which is for mentally or erratic persons having difficulty. Go through the Police Department.

2 petitions were circulated regarding opposing recent actions taken by NJ BPU which seek to begin the electrification of appliances including stoves and furnaces. 3672 is the Senate bill, 5591 is the Assembly bill. We should all have a choice on what we want regarding electric or gas. The other Bills are just sitting there right now. Associations are dealing with underage/drug members living with seniors. It is the association's responsibility to hire an attorney and take them to court.

Jim Vaccaro Councilman was introduced. On September 6 there was a meeting with our Energy Aggregator and no contract was awarded. Bids came through at around 11 cents or higher and JCPL came in a little lower at 10 cents per kilowatt. In March 2024 new bids will be requested. Right now don't sign up for any new program.

A community is having difficulty with the water pressure in their homes. Jim Vaccaro responded that at the executive meeting, they will be discussing the Infrastructure for sewer and water. We will apply for grants and for the developing we have to do. They are also discussing a re-evaluation that will take place. It will take a year to complete. A third will go up, a third will go down and a third will stay the same. Manchester assessments were done 3 years ago and should be done every 10 years. The reason is the resale values in Manchester have increased substantially.

Village 5 has been conducting free CPR first aid classes first Saturday of the month. Call 732-350-0700. The second Saturday of the month they offer free technology classes. Classes are 10am-12pm.

Next month's meeting will be held on Monday, 11/13/23 with guest speaker Ocean county Surrogate Jeffrey W. Moran.

MINUTE

Hello Residents of Village 1,

Total Work Orders (past 30 days) = 317

Hopefully, I am really early when it comes to mentioning this, but with the conflicting weather reports I would like to discuss our guidelines for snow removal. The information provided below comes directly from the Board of Trustees. The biggest thing we can request is that all residents stay inside when the street and driveway clearing is underway and to please exercise patience and understanding during these times. Special consideration for priority snow removal will only be arranged for medical appointments and outpatient treatments. You are required to provide the Trustee's Office a copy of your doctor's name, phone number and time of your appointment on your respective doctor's letterhead. This must be provided in advance, we will not be able to accommodate calls made the morning of a snow storm. After verifying the information provided, the Board of Trustees and the Trustees Office will prioritize the clearing of these units. The Board of Trustees will not make special arrangements for those that are employed, it will not entitle you to priority snow removal. Please do not call the Maintenance Department to request individual attention, the only ones that can authorize priority snow plowing are the Trustees.

- Roads will not be plowed until there is 3" of snow accumulation;
- When icy conditions are present, ice melt will be applied to the roads;
- NO on-street parking is allowed for impending snow, you will be assessed a \$50 fine and parking on the grass is not acceptable. If you do leave your vehicle on the grass or road during plowing activities, you will be plowed in. If you require assistance to get your vehicle out, you will be charged a minimum of \$60 for the service and will not be addressed until all other snow clearing activities are completed;
- Residents are not to push, shovel, blow or deposit snow onto Village roadways;
- When the roads are made passable, the Maintenance Department will begin to clear driveways, then followed by sidewalks;
- Duplex driveways will be cleared and treated as sidewalks, as you do have secondary means to exit and enter through your garage door;
- Quad driveways will be cleared by pushing the snow forward towards the buildings or to the side when available, depending on the positioning of your building;
- Sidewalks will be cleared as soon as possible, depending on the man-power that is available;
- Keep a bag or two of ice melt on hand for your steps and sidewalk area (available through the Maintenance Department, call for pricing and for delivery);

THERE WILL BE NO DEVIATION FROM OUR SNOW REMOVAL PROGRAM.



ANCHOR Benefit

NJ says nearly 1M ANCHOR property tax payments have been delivered. *Did you get yours?*

ANCHOR Benefit filing season is under way. Check the **status of your benefit**. If you received an **"ANCHOR Benefit Confirmation Letter "** and did not make any updates to your application by September 30, 2023, no further changes can be made to your application at this time.

Payments will be issued on a rolling basis. Most applicants can expect to receive their payment approximately 90 days after filing the application, unless we request additional information to process your claim.

Filing Deadline

There is still plenty of time to file. You have until Friday, December 29, 2023, to file an application.

How to Apply

Taxpayers who received a **green or purple filing packet** should follow the instructions in the packet to apply for their benefit. If you meet the qualifications for the benefit based on 2020 residency, income, and age eligibility - but you did not receive a packet from us – you may still apply for the program.

Homeowners

Most homeowners may file **online** or by phone (**877**) **658-2972** with an **identification number (ID) and PIN.** However, if you bought your home in 2020, altered your deed, or had certain life changes such as a divorce or death of a spouse, you must file an **application by mail.**

Melt butter into cream in a large pot or saucepan over medium heat, then and minced garlic. Stir in grated Parmesan cheese until melted and sauce has thickened.


Add cooked pasta to sauce and toss until thoroughly coated; serve immediately.
