

MANCHESTER COORDINATING COUNCIL

MCC monthly meeting was held Monday, October 23, 2023, at Village 5 clubhouse

Judy Noonan discussed again the 9th District's principled stance in opposition to S-2537/A-4106. They oppose these bills which seek to undermine existing occupancy regulations for age 55+ communities. Residents value their communities' autonomy, including the ability to enforce age-restriction residency requirements, and rightfully believe that Trenton has more important issues to focus on, such as reducing taxes and limiting government. —Connors, Rumpf, and Gove.

Honorable Joseph Vicari Commissioner was presented with a 2023 Outstanding Citizen Award recognizing his dedication to Ocean County for over 43 years. He stressed the fact that people need to get involved. There is a concern regarding the pharmacy's closings and the effects it may have on seniors. Ocean County Food distribution is so important, Not one senior citizen will go hungry if they know about it. Food banks are there for all who need assistance you will not be questioned. They are always looking for federal grants and ways to get money to come to Ocean County. We thanked him for his wonderful accomplishments for Ocean County.

Verizon getting into the area is being worked on at this time. Negotiations are still in progress regarding Comcast. Classes will be held in January regarding boards and management. Information to follow. No solicitors are allowed in private communities. There is a No-knock ordinance. If someone wants to right to solicit, they have to go to the police department. They will receive a card ID with their picture. A background check is completed. They must be registered with the police department that they are allowed to solicit. They are giving a list of communities they are not allowed in. Manchester has a no-knock ordinance. You register with the Manchester township at the town hall, they give you a sticker to put on your door. You have 2 lines of defense, the sign at the entrance to your community and your no-knock sticker on the door. Police will issue a summons to offenders.

Deborah Hospital has a program where if you are referred by a VA doctor through the Hero Connect program, you can get free services.

The meeting adjourned 3PM.

It's time to prepare for the holidays - Christmas, Hanukkah, and New Years. The main subjects are family and friends. I run this article every December because I think this is a good time for a review.

For candid shots make certain you're prepared -- have your camera ready and watch the subject for the expression you want. If you aren't ready the shot will be gone before you press the shutter. Most holiday shots will be taken indoors so don't forget to use your camera's flash.

For portraits and group shots get yourself set up first, and then prepare your subject. If you keep them waiting you will not get a natural relaxed image. For portraits choose a background that's festive, but not too busy. Have your subject(s) turn their shoulders slightly so they are not too square to the camera.

When photographing grandchildren or pets try to get eye level with them, rather than shooting down at them.

I also like to photograph the festive holiday decorations. These often make fun shots and they can be used on your holiday cards next year.

Don't forget the rule of thirds (also from a previous photo tip). Rather than placing your subjects in front of the



Christmas tree, move them slightly to one side. If shooting the dinner table set for the holiday feast, have the host stand at one side of the table about 1/3 of the way from the end, rather than centered at the end of the table.

These techniques will help improve your images holiday images. Have a great holiday season, a happy and healthy New Year and remember to have fun with your camera.

Happy Holidays Residents of Village 1!

I am sure I am not alone in saying this, but where did this year go? It has certainly been a busy one for us, but if you are one of our newer residents that we haven't had the pleasure to meet or talk with, welcome and we wish you good health and lots of luck in your new residence. This month I feel it would be best to make this article sort of a grab bag of different topics that have been dealt with in the past and those that we will be sure to be dealing with in the future. If you ever have a concern about a problem that you are having please contact us at the Maintenance Office ((732) 350-2202) or the Trustees Office ((732) 350-1818), don't ever feel that you are bothering or us, you think it's insignificant or maybe you feel that it might be slightly embarrassing...we are here to help you and if we can't help you directly, we can surely point you in the right direction to get the assistance you need. Often times things are not reported and we cannot help you if we do not know there is something to address. You can email us here at the Maintenance Department using our general email at crestwood1maintenance@gmail.com.

Flushable Wipes/Plumbing

Believe it or not, this topic has been thrust into the forefront due to several recent issues the Village has been experiencing. On several separate occasions, our main sanitary sewers have become packed solid in the streets to a point where the sewage has actually come out the manhole covers located in the streets and/or have backed up into buildings with the same. The biggest culprit? Glad you asked, it is toilet wipes...flushable, non-flushable, septic and sewer safe, paper towels and anything else that is out there as a commercial product. These items do not break down like toilet paper as advertised and it will travel down the sanitary sewer and before long we have a major issue as soon as it gets caught up. You have to try and remember that these sewers and plumbing in most cases under the buildings are nearly 60 years old. Over that time there have been reports of some pretty weird things coming out of the plumbing causing blockages, which is not great, but at least you can understand why something would be getting clogged up. These wipes will just accumulate to a point where no water is able to pass through. The Maintenance Department will be the first to try to eliminate the clog, but if there is a substantial blockage, the Village has to contact an outside contractor and this will typically cost the Village almost \$600 per occurrence for them to come out and service. If they cannot clear the blockage, this means the blockage is out into the street and Manchester Township will come to clear the blockage in the street.

There are times where it is simply a blockage, but if the Maintenance Department or one of the services identifies wipes as the cause of the blockage, the Board of Trustees has voted to make this chargeable back to the resident. There are some instances where it is very obvious and if it is, the resident responsible for flushing of these wipes will be expected to pay not only for any repairs, but the cost for the outside contractor as well.

THE FLUSHING OF FLUSHABLE, NON-FLUSHABLE, SEPTIC AND SEWER SAFE WIPES AND PAPER TOWELS IS NO LONGER PERMITTED IN CRESTWOOD VILLAGE 1. IF YOU MUST USE WIPES OF ANY VARIETY MUST BE THROWN OUT WITH YOUR HOUSEHOLD TRASH. THE ONLY THING THAT CAN BE FLUSHED IS TOILET PAPER.

Cooking grease is another huge issue affecting our plumbing systems. Please use caution and limit any grease that you might deposit down your kitchen sink drain, these can block up the works if too much grease goes down. Please consider putting the grease into a container and depositing it into your household trash or following the moto "when in doubt, melt it out"...simply meaning if any grease going down the drain is followed by a copious amount of hot water.

Leaves

Far too often while driving in Village 1, I am seeing many residents that have either started to blow the leaves and needles from their properties into the street along the curb. These piles will not be picked up by the Village or the mowers. Additionally, raking, blowing or making piles of leaves on your properties for the mowers to pick up is also not allowed. The mowers will not drive over

these piles as they don't know what's under it and will not take the risk to avoid damage to their mowers. The cuts become more spread out during this time of the year and the leaves will remain piled up there.

Residents are expected to utilize brown paper leaf bags to collect the needles and leaves from the property. The Village provides WEEKLY brush and bag pickups on Thursdays, please utilize this service as it helps to keep our community nice and tidy. You can get these bags from any hardware store.

Snow

So I am going to really try to drive this topic home, as reports for this winter's forecast are all over the place. As always, we are going to hope for the best, but prepare for the worst. Snow stakes by the time of this publication will be out and into the appropriate locations as decided by the Maintenance Department. PLEASE do not remove or move these snow stakes, they are located in these positions for a reason and that is to minimize potential damage to driveways, garbage cans, mailboxes and storm drains. There is absolutely no on-street parking during snow storms, you will be buried in and charged if you do need assistance to get out. The procedure calls for street plowing to begin at 3" of accumulation, then the driveways and then finally the sidewalks. If you have a regularly scheduled medical appointment, you must provide this to the Trustees Office on paper with the doctor's letterhead on it. These are the only residents that will be provided advanced service to give them the opportunity to get to their needed appointments.
