While we do have an election committee together, we are forming a budget committee. With new rules, with fines attached, issued by the Township, we have been forced to be much stricter with tree removals. We are now required to obtain a Township permit which would only be issued after Township inspector approves the removal. If they deny a permit, the permit fee would have still been paid. If you should remove a tree and the Township issues a fine, that fine would be charged to your account along with possible Village fines. If you have a tree of concern, please be sure to address the Trustees office and we will look into it. Please do not take it upon yourself as it could be costly for you.

We have resumed our monthly open meetings. They are scheduled for the 4th Thursday of each month at 10am in the "A" room of the clubhouse. The Board of Trustees will take questions and if an answer can't be given, we will get back to you with the answer. You must be a certificate holder and state your name and address before asking your question. This is a good way to see how the Village operates. We hope to see you at these open meetings.

Library News



MANCHESTER COORDINATING COUNCIL

MCC monthly meeting was held Monday, October 23, 2023, at Village 5 clubhouse

OEM Manchester Ocean County Management Sqt. Robert Sharry and John Kirwin were introduced. Sqt Sharry brought up the recent snow/snow removal in regards to the recent snow we just had. Most communities in Whiting are private entities; the roads are owned by the development. The police and emergency management department will be able to help someone get out of their homes in an emergency. They have a multitude of 4-wheel drive vehicles for emergencies. Code Blue is any time it's cold, the warming stations will be set up. They are usually located in Berkeley, Toms River, and Lakewood. Set up for mainly homeless or someone having difficulty maintaining the heat in their house for any reason. Social Services will then try to set up a plan of action to assist them. Most importantly neighbors should be watching out for neighbors. Most Manchester clubhouses have generator power that can be opened up as warming stations if needed. This is the same for cooling stations. The smart meters that are being changed out will automatically be able to read your meter, JCPL will also see immediately who's power is out. In the event of an evacuation emergency, people would direct where to go. Most communities have a generator for their residents, and OEM will set up other locations. **Programs available are:** Register ready, anyone with a disability or medical condition, wheelchair bound, or mobility problems should be on this program. Contact John Kirwin who is a deputy coordinator with Ocean County Sheriff's Office OEM, 732-341-3451. Fill out the form and submit it to OEM so they know who needs assistance in an emergency. A class for emergency response team CERT BASIC TRAINING, class coming up starting 2/26/24. 5 weekly classes on Mondays from 6pm - 9pm, registration is required, call John Kirwin. Manchester uses the NIXIL program. Text 888 777 08759 automatically registers your cell phone with Nixil. You will get the notification texts, also, go on Nixil.com and register your house.

Judy Noonan Legislative chairwoman announced bills she is watching that are in the works and wanted us to be aware of: S762, S595, S2537, S686, 5595, 4026, S2760.

Martin Lynch Manchester tax assessor was introduced. Five years ago was the last assessment. He has meetings scheduled at communities in Manchester. Co-Ops and mobile homes board of trustees will be notified when the preliminary value of the co-op is completed, go over the value with the co-op, and what the individual co-op values are. Today he is giving us a grand over assessments of what to expect. The Co-ops will not be individual inspection assessments. A Reassessment or re-evaluation is synonymous with each other. A Reassessment is done by the tax assessor, a re-evaluation is done by an outside company, and the difference is cost. A re-evaluation is the process of appraising all real estate in the municipality to its full and fair value. Bringing all the assessed values up to market. The process is people paying their fair share, a revenue-neutral process. Example: Say Village 5 and Village 6 are similar. Village 5 is under-valued, Village 6 is over-valued, this corrects that. Adjusting assessments according to market value. 22,000 properties will be assessed. 17,000 homes. The inspection will be going on. Interior takes only a few minutes, they will know the model. Looking at the condition of the property. How updated it is. Categories are All Original, Totally Renovated, and Some renovations.

Physical description of your house is one part; what are similar homes selling for? That's how the new assessment is going to be figured. It's to your advantage to let the inspector in. We don't know the total value of the town yet, until they are done with everyone's value, they won't know the impact of taxes going up or down. It's all revenue-neutral. Equalizing the assessments, making sure they are fair. 1/3 will see a decrease, 1/3 increase, 1/3 will stay the same. Around the end of November 2024 — January 2025, every home will receive a letter from his office explaining what the new assessed value is. He will explain to each co-op their values.

The meeting adjourned 3:12 PM, February 26, 2024, next meeting.



Death By Chocolate

Ingredients:

- 2 cups flour
- 1 tablespoon double acting baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 2 cups sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 stick butter at room temp.
- 1 cup sour cream
- 1/2 cup water
- 2 teaspoons of vanilla extract
- 1/2 cup plus 2 tablespoons cocoa
- 1 12oz. package of semisweet chocolate chips.



Sift flour, baking powder, and baking soda twice. Place in a small bowl. Beat sugar and eggs in large mixing bowl until sugar is dissolved. Add butter and mix eggs in thoroughly. Add sour cream, water, vanilla and beat. Add the flour mixture and cocoa until smooth. Fold in chocolate chips and pour into greased Bundt pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour. Powder sugar on top when cooled. Enjoy!

PAAD 2024 REQUIREMENTS

The Pharmaceutical Assistance to the Aged and Disabled (PAAD) program is a state-funded program that helps eligible older adults and individuals with disabilities save money on their prescription drug costs.

PAAD provides coverage for prescribed legend drugs, insulin and insulin supplies, and needled and syringes for injectable medicines used for the treatment of multiple sclerosis.

The PAAD co-payment will be \$5 for each PAAD covered generic drug prescription and \$7 for each PAAD covered brand name drug prescription. PAAD beneficiaries may pay less for generic drugs if their Medicare prescription drug plan charges them less than the \$5 PAAD co-payment for generics.

PAAD does not pay for diabetic testing supplies (e.g., test strips and lancets). If PAAD beneficiaries have health insurance coverage, such as Medicare Part B that pays for diabetic testing supplies a pharmacy must bill that insurance plan. PAAD will not pay for them.

Only drugs approved by the Food and Drug Administration are covered. Drugs purchased outside the State of New Jersey are not covered, nor is any pharmaceutical product whose manufacturer has not agreed to provide rebates to the State of New Jersey.

You may be eligible for PAAD if you meet the following requirements:

- You are a New Jersey resident;
- You are age 65 or older or between ages 18 and 64 and receiving Social Security Title II Disability benefits; and
- Your income for 2024 is less than \$52,142 if single or less than \$59,209 if married.

Hello Residents of Village 1!

With the recent snow events, I feel this is a very good opportunity to review the Snow Removal Policy here in Crestwood Village 1. The information provided below comes directly from the Board of Trustees and is published in the Rules and Regulations governing Village 1. The biggest thing we can request is that all residents stay inside when the street and driveway clearing is underway and to please exercise patience and understanding during these times. Special consideration for priority snow removal will only be arranged for medical appointments and outpatient treatments. You are required to provide the Trustee's Office a copy of your doctor's name, phone number and time of your appointment on your respective doctor's letterhead. This must be provided in advance, we will not be able to accommodate calls made the morning of a snow storm. After verifying the information provided, the Board of Trustees and the Trustees Office will prioritize the clearing of these units. The Board of Trustees will not make special arrangements for those that are employed, it will not entitle you to priority snow removal. Please do not call the Maintenance Department to request individual attention, the only ones that can authorize priority snow plowing are the Trustees. The information provided below is pulled directly from page 2 of the Rules and Regulations.

Snow Removal Policy Rule 9

9(a). No on street or on grass parking is permitted. Move cars to Clubhouse parking lot at notice of an impending storm. Any vehicle left on the Village streets during a storm will constitute a \$100 fine. Failure to comply with any of the above can result in the vehicle being towed.

9(b). Roads will be cleared as soon as 3" of snow has fallen regardless of the time of day.

9(c). After all roads are passable, the Maintenance Dept. will start clearing driveways and sidewalks.

9(d). Duplex driveways will be cleared and should be considered as sidewalks.

9(e). Quads will be cleared by pushing snow forward or to the side, depending on the position of the unit.

9(f). Sidewalks will be cleared in Quads following cleanup of parking lot.

9(g). It is advisable for each resident to stock their pantry with enough emergency food so that you will not have to venture out in bad weather.

9(h). Keep a bag of Ice Melt on hand for sidewalks and steps. It is the resident's responsibility to treat their own sidewalks and steps with Ice Melt.

9(i). Removal of snow less than three (3) inches, freezing of melted snow and ice upon the sidewalks and driveways are the responsibility of the individual members. Ice Melt is available for purchase in the Maintenance Office.

9(j). For those residents who are employed, your employment will not entitle you to priority snow clearing. We ask that all residents exercise patience and understanding. Please do not call the Maintenance Dept. to request individual attention.

9(k). Special consideration for priority clearing will only be granted for medical appointments and outpatient treatments. You will be required to furnish a doctor's note, phone number, and time of appointment. Your appointment and the doctor's availability will be verified before any priority snow clearing is authorized.

Additionally, roads will not be plowed until there is 3" of snow accumulation on paved surfaces. Residents are not to push, shovel, blow or deposit snow onto Village roadways or into neighboring parking spots. Keep a bag or two of ice melt on hand for your steps and sidewalk area (available through the Maintenance Department, call for pricing and for delivery).

THERE WILL BE NO DEVIATION FROM OUR SNOW REMOVAL PROGRAM.
