If anyone has anything they may want to address, please, call the office, send an email or a letter. This is my first article and I already have requests for 4 more. It may take some time before I'm able to get to it.

As we enter March we start moving towards Spring (in like a lion, out like a lamb). There will be more people walking, jogging, riding their bikes and walking their dogs. Some will have grand-children visiting.

Over the years I have been told we can't do anything about it. I have trouble accepting NO until I have exhausted all options.

If anyone has any ideas that may help, please, contact the office. They will let me know. I can use any help or suggestions that you may have. I would like to be proactive instead of reactive.

MANCHESTER COORDINATING COUNCIL

MCC monthly meeting was held Monday, February 26, 2024, at Village 5 clubhouse

Melissa from Manchester Senior Services was introduced. They have 2 locations, 1 Colonial Drive on Monday thru Friday and 82 Lacey Rd. in Whiting (Manchester EMS Building) on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. Veterans Affairs are also in Whiting EMS Bldg. on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday.

Manchester Township still has the lockbox program. This is intended to provide vulnerable seniors with a way of letting emergency responders enter their homes. You're encouraged that once a combination is set and a key has been placed inside, it be shared with the local police dept. Call Manchester Senior Services at 732-849-8305.

Manchester Twp is starting a Senior Social program, light snacks will be served. March 4, from 1PM — 3:30PM at Manchester EMS building, and March 8 from 1PM — 3PM at 1 Colonial Drive.

Manchester Senior Services now offers non-medical transportation. Call Manchester Senior Outreach at 732-849-8305.

On April 25, 1PM at Manchester town hall and April 23,1 PM at Village 5 Clubhouse a Fall Prevention and Pedestrian Safety Program for older adults will be held sponsored by the Brain Injury Alliance of NJ.

Senator Carmen Amato, Assemblyman Brian Rumpf and Assemblyman Greg Myhre were introduced. Manchester is now part of the 9th Legislative District. Manchester has a lot of Seniors and Veterans. They are keeping a close eye on where our tax dollars are going. The Senior Tax Freeze and Anchor Rebate are currently under way. If you have an issue contact their office, they have great connections with the State of NJ. They have helped over 1000 people with the Anchor rebate. For additional info visit <u>nj.gov/taxtion</u>, select I am looking for property tax relief, and the Senior Freeze Program. Call the Senior Freeze hotline at **(800) 882-6597**.

We have to keep a close eye on changes to the Radburn Act, Bill 2271 that was re-introduced, and Bill 83705. Issues regarding the Environmental Protection and Ciba-Geigy that affect all our lives were discussed. The settlement did not come close to the damage that was done in Toms River, Berkeley, and Manchester. Homeless Veterans and Seniors are a great concern in Ocean County and Manchester. We need to do better to help our Veterans in need. Tuckerton is building housing designed specifically for veterans. County wide there is a trust fund, every time someone reports a deed there is a dollar amount that goes towards the homelessness trust fund.



Sift dry ingredients into mixing bowl. Add caraway seeds. Mix in butter until mixture looks course then stir in raisins. Combine buttermilk and 1 egg. Turn onto floured board and knead until dough is smooth.

Shape into a ball and place in a greased 2 qt. pan.

Cut a 4" cross in top of dough and brush with egg yolk.

Cook at 375 for about 1 hour or until toothpick comes out clean.

Remove from pan after 10 minutes and let cool on a wire rack. Cut and enjoy.

MANCHESTER BRUSH & LEAF PICKUP Tuesday, March 19, 2024

Leaves and pine needles must be raked to the curb in a single row, no earlier than 2 days prior to the scheduled pick up. Leaves will be vacuumed up utilizing large equipment and a clear path is required. All vehicles should be parked away from leaf rows to expedite the process. Leaves mixed with any brush or debris will not be picked up. Brush and garden waste, clippings and other vegetative waste must be placed in a separate container.

Branches must be tied into manageable bundles, less than 4-ft. long and under 50 lbs., with a max. branch diameter of 3-inches. Loose & unmanageable branches and waste will not be picked up.

SENIOR FREEZE (Property Tax Reimbursement)

The Senior Freeze Program reimburses eligible senior citizens and disabled persons for <u>property tax</u> or <u>mobile home park site fee</u> increases on their <u>principal residence</u> (main home). To qualify, you must meet all the <u>eligibility requirements</u> for each year from the <u>base year</u> through the application year.

Eligibility requirements, including income limits, and benefits available for all property tax relief programs are subject to change by the State Budget.

2023 Applications

We began mailing Senior Freeze applications on February 12, 2024. If you do not receive your booklet by late March, you may contact us at **1-800-882-6597**.

First-time filers or those who must reestablish a base year may

print the PTR-1 application and/or instructions.

2023 Filing Deadline

The deadline for 2023 application is October 31, 2024.

2023 Payment Schedule

We will begin issuing 2023 payments to qualified applicants in July.

Important Program Changes

Beginning with the 2023 filing season, new legislation increased the income limit for the program to \$150,000 for Tax Year 2022, benefitting those filing the 2023 PTR-1. The law also eliminated the requirement that an applicant must be a New Jersey resident for 10 consecutive years to be eligible for the program.

The age/disability and three-year homeownership requirements remain unchanged.

Hello Residents of Village 1!

Total Work Orders (past 30 days) = 222

This month I've been requested to discuss The Almighty List(s) as it applies to different jobs across Crestwood Village 1. As some of you have probably experienced first-hand, sometimes you call the Village 1 Maintenance Department and are told you are "on the list or there is a list for that". These lists cover many, many different topics. From trees, to garbage cans, to dryer vents, to roofs, to exhaust vents and for most everything the Village 1 Co-op and the Maintenance Department are responsible for. There are 1,016 individual units spread amongst 355 buildings and believe it or not, this can get a bit difficult when considering the time and manpower required to handle our day to day requests and not to mention the exuberant amount of budgetary commitment these projects demand.

Each year your Board of Trustees works endlessly to try and budget accordingly for all these tasks and backlogged lists, but they are in the unenvious position of trying to keep your monthly Maintenance fees at a minimal increase year to year while trying to plan for what the next year will bring. Between the ever rising costs of everything in the world and issues with material delivery, this is very difficult to forecast and therefore lists were created. This is a means for us to track what has been completed to date, planning for the lists and tasks that are known while anticipating future issues for completion of additional tasks as our budget permits.

Some of our lists are created to track property addresses and tasks in a chronological manner so we can address them in the order in which they were received. These apply primarily to dryer and exhaust vents. There is a dedicated budget to these jobs and when the money runs dry, the list is maintained and rolled to the following year. Other lists are created so the Maintenance Department can do a group of similar type jobs, dedicating manpower, materials and equipment to specific tasks. Rather than doing a small job or two at a time, just to end up going back and remobilize for the following week and doing the same thing again. These lists are more for our garbage can replacements and similar type jobs that make sense to dedicate a half or full day to it, as our schedule through Maintenance changes weekly.

Then there are the lists in which we are forced to prioritize the situation due to dangerous or safety related issues. This is to minimize the potential for additional damage to occur while protecting our residents and their belongings. These lists are primarily for tree work, roof replacements, plumbing and structural concerns.

Please understand that it is not just of smoke being blown around, but the list is the primary way in which we can track all past and future work. Of course it would be optimal to be able to address each item as it comes up, however due to associated costs this is not a luxury that is provided to the Co-op. The Village 1 Co-op and the Maintenance Department work very diligently to make sure each list is addressed annually. There are always going to be situations on a year to year basis that are unplanned for which do effect the list process, but we always strive to meet the demands as both our budget and ability allows.

Make sure you are reporting any issues or problems you see in Village 1, you the residents, are truly the eyes and ears of the Village.
