Some important and trivia days in June;

- **June 6th** — The Allied liberation of France began with the D-Day landings in Normandy on June 6, 1944. It culminated in the liberation of Paris on August 25, 1944, after a brutal battle and the German garrison's surrender.
- **November 8th to 10th** — During World War II, French forces, under the control of the German-occupied regime, fired on Allied forces during the Allied invasion of North Africa (Operation Torch) in November 1942. - **Some of the National Days (not holidays) celebrated in June;**
- Nature Photography Day, National Lobster Day, Global Wind Day, Beer Day Britain, World Elder Abuse Awareness Day.

- **June 6th** — D-Day
- **July 4th** — Independence Day

- Cars must park head-on, backing into a parking space is not permitted. Please don't risk being fined and having your vehicle towed.

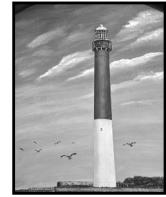

MINUTE

Hello Residents of Crestwood Village 1!

Total Work Orders (past 30 days) = 315

This month I would like to discuss the use of drain cleaners when trying to deal with either a slow draining or completely backed up sink or bathtub. This is something discussed in previous monthly Maintenance Minutes, but it continues to be a problem for the Maintenance Crew. The commercially purchased drain cleaners (Liquid Plumber, Drano, Green Gobbler, Liquid Power, etc.) are very caustic and have the potential to injure our Maintenance workers. Purchasing one of these commercial cleaners is a cheaper alternative (and is not always effective), but the Maintenance Department has the ability to correct any clogs without the use of these abrasive cleaners. If you are a do-it yourselfer, please consider a less dangerous alternative, there are a number of options that have been reported as being very effective. Including, but not limited to: baking soda/vinegar/hot water combination, baking soda/salt/hot water combination, salt/borax/vinegar combination or dish soap and hot water combination.

After having a plumbing backup of my own recently, the technician told me "when in doubt, melt it out". As he explained to me, just about everything you put down the drain will eventually back-up the plumbing....soap, shampoo/conditioner, food and especially grease when not properly flushed. What he meant by letting it melt out, was to run super-hot water once a month or as needed, to a point where

the hot water heater tank almost runs empty and that should help to eliminate the build-up of the stuff that can and will cause clogs over time.

Please see below for a picture showing how destructive these products can be, this is or was a pair of jeans...maybe we can sell them since horribly ripped jeans seem to be the new fashion trend. Besides just clothing getting destroyed, this causes serious chemical burns to skin and thankfully we haven't had an issue with any coming in contact with eyes.

If you do use any of the commercial drain cleaners to try and eliminate the clogged plumbing, PLEASE tell the Maintenance Department what was used and how much so we can properly prepare to service the lines. Every once in a while, the clogged plumbing is so bad that the Maintenance Department actually has to remove a portion of the drain pipe because everything basically solidified, not allowing any water to pass. Also remember that all the plumbing in your building, with 2 or 4 units, do share a common main plumbing line. All we can do is ask that people avoid sending stuff down the drains as much as possible and that everyone does their part to try and keep the plumbing systems running smoothly.

HOPA

The Housing for Older People Act

What is a HOPA?

The Housing for Older People Act* (HOPA) was approved by the Senate and House of Representatives and signed into law in 1995. This federal law states that it is legal for communities to market themselves as "55+" or "age-restricted" provided they maintain that 80% of the residential units are occupied by at least one person who is 55 years of age or older. However, if the number of persons age 55+ in a given community falls below the 80% threshold, CV1 could lose its age-restricted status **(and loss of such status would be permanent)**.

Every two years (odd Years), the State of New Jersey mandates all age restricted communities HOA's collect a HOPA Survey from every living unit. The collection of data requests provisioning of the names of all residential occupants, ages and dates of birth.

How Can We Keep Our 55+ Status

With 100% community participation we can prove that 80% of Crestwood Village 1 meets the necessary age requirement under the HOPA law. Your participation is essential to ensure our community maintains its HOPA status.

We have many members who did not fill out the HOPA form. It is in this newsletter on the following page.

Please fill it out and drop it off at the office or put in the mailbox in front of the clubhouse.

HOPA Survey (Housing for Older People Act)

The HOPA provides housing for older persons and is intended for occupancy by at least one person 55 years of age or older per unit. It requires that periodically information must be collected and verified with the age of all residents. If a survey is not completed, the senior housing community could lose its housing status.

It is mandatory that this survey be completed and filed with the Co-Op office.
