However, after Caesar's death, Quintilis was renamed in his honor as Iulius, which evolved into the English name July. Here are some other dates of interest in July:

Independence Day (July 4th in the USA):

On July 4, 1776, the Second Continental Congress formally adopted the Declaration of Independence, declaring the 13 American colonies independent from Great Britain. This document, primarily written by Thomas Jefferson, stated the reasons for separation and declared the colonies to be free and independent states. While the vote for independence had already occurred on July 2nd, July 4th became the date commemorated as the birth of American independence.

Canada Day (July 1st):

Canada commemorates its founding as a nation on this day.

Bastille Day (July 14th in France):

Celebrates the storming of the Bastille prison, a key event in the French Revolution.

Other National and International Observances:

July hosts various other national and international days and awareness months, including National Hot Dog Month, National Ice Cream Month, Disability Pride Month and National Minority Mental Health Awareness Month.

Please take a moment to remember how we gained our independence and all those that have served our nation. They have protected our freedoms and given us the chance to celebrate. I think sometimes we may forget what the holiday really means, many countries don't have the freedom that we enjoy. It's also the time of year when we do many projects for our homes. Road Sealcoating – July 7, 2025 - WEATHER PERMITTING

This correspondence has been prepared as a notification that your section of road will be undergoing road sealcoating of the asphalt on July 7, 2025. American Asphalt has been hired by the Crestwood Village Co-op, Inc. (Co-op) to complete this project.

If you reside at any of the following addresses, you must adhere to the directions provided below. YOU ARE NOT PERMITTED TO DRIVE ON THE NEW SEALCOAT FOR 24 HOURS.

- Columbine Avenue will be closed from Aster Place to Laurel Place intersection.
 Addresses affected: 161 through 171 Columbine Ave, 174 through 182 Columbine Ave.
- Aster Place will be closed to Laurel Place intersection.
 Addresses affected:160, 183, 240, 269, 270 Aster Place.
- End of Columbine will be closed to Laurel Place intersection.
 Addresses affected: 219 through 226 Columbine Ave

Once work commences, you will not be able to pull out of your driveway or leave your residence in a vehicle. Please plan accordingly to have your vehicles located on adjacent roads. There is NO on-street parking on the roads where the sealcoat is being applied. Any vehicle on the roadway @ 6:30am the morning of sealcoating will be towed at the owner's expense. You are permitted to temporarily park on adjacent roads until the roadwork is completed and the roads opened back up.

DO NOT BLOCK MAILBOXES OR GARBAGE CANS. NO ON STREET PARKING IS PERMITTED.

American Asphalt will remove the barriers on the following day of the work being completed. **The** road will require 24 hours to properly cure and there will be absolutely NO driving until the road blocks have been removed.

The roads cannot be wet, please do not have your sprinkler systems on for the day your street is scheduled for sealcoating.

Inclement weather will result in work being rescheduled. The road sealcoating will be pushed to the end of the entire schedule; notices will be provided for new dates.

Congressman Van Drew Releases Statement on Utility Rate <u>Hike Delay</u>

Washington, DC -Today, Congressman Van Drew released the following statement in response to the announcement that New Jersey utility companies are delaying the steep electricity increase that was set to take effect this month until the fall. While the hike is being postponed, consumers will still be expected to pay the full amount with the increase being spread out over a longer period of time.

"While delaying these higher bills is better than making people pay right away, it does nothing to solve the underlying issue," said Congressman Van Drew. "Families will still have to pay the full amount, just later. New Jerseyans deserve real, long-lasting relief instead of a temporary solution. What is truly unacceptable is that Atlantic City Electric (ACE) and Exelon continue to rake in profits while passing the burden of rising costs onto hardworking families. Instead of working to lower rates, they invest in unnecessary projects like smart meters, something no one wants, which only increases their profits. Meanwhile, they expect New Jerseyans to pay the bill. Now is the time for these companies to stop making things worse and start being a part of the solution.

"I am working at the federal level to implement policies that bring energy costs down and prevent big hikes like this from happening in the first place, but the State needs to start acting on long-term solutions like nuclear and gas. We need to fix the root causes of our energy deficit so we can lower costs and keep power reliable. The people deserve affordable utilities and a plan that actually fixes the problem, not one that just delays it."



Hello Members of Village 1,

Happy Summer! Hope everyone is managing to stay cool out there! For the past month, the Maintenance Department has handled 262 work orders. This month I would like to talk about the procedure for disposing of your household trash, recyclables and bulk trash. Every week we are receiving calls with members not adhering to the correct protocol when it comes to getting rid of their household garbage.

Household Trash

Crestwood Village 1 offers weekly trash pick-up services on Mondays and Thursdays, please check the Village Newsletter for your scheduled pickup days when these days fall on a holiday. The household trash should be limited to food scraps, paper garbage or other trash that fits inside of your standard trash bag. These bags must be put into the trash receptacles the night before or the morning of your scheduled trash pickup day by 6:00 AM. If you have excessive garbage bags that cannot fit into the trash can, you can neatly place them on top of the can or next to the can. Please do not exceed 1 - 2 additional bags of trash. We strongly urge against placing these bags out until the morning of your pickup day to reduce the chance of critters helping themselves, tearing into the bags resulting in an unsightly mess. Furniture, rugs, unbagged trash or other large items will require a separate pickup. Paint and chemicals are never permitted to be thrown out into the household trash. Please contact the Maintenance Department if you feel your household trash was missed on your scheduled pickup days. If you do put any unbagged items out or too many bags for the garbage trucks, the Maintenance Department will be contacted to remove these items and you will be charged accordingly.

Recyclables

Manchester Township provides pickup of recyclables on a bi-weekly schedule, Crestwood Village 1 has no involvement with these pickups. Please check the Village Newsletter for your scheduled pickup days. Recyclables must be placed in a plastic container or trash can, bags of any variety will not be picked up.

Please make sure your recyclables are covered with a lid. Your recyclables should be placed out by your garbage can on the night prior to your pick-up or the morning of your pickup day by 6:00 AM. Newspapers, periodicals or magazines can be bound in small bundles and placed out at the same time. If you feel that your recyclables were missed on your scheduled pickup days, please contact Manchester Township directly to report.

Crestwood Village 1 is now selling covered recycling bins at \$20.00 each, please call for availability.

Light Bulk Trash

Crestwood Village 1 offers a free pickup of your light bulk trash on the last Wednesday of every month. This free pickup is intended to provide members with a means to dispose of a FEW larger items, not picked up by the normal household trash pickups. It is suggested you have these items out the night before, as Maintenance begins early on these pickup days and will not be able to return to a property once their pickups are complete. This is not intended to clean out an entire unit's worth of belongings.

In-House Pickups

The Maintenance Department can be contacted to assist in the removal of items too large for members. This is a chargeable work order and is dependent upon the amount of stuff to be removed from the unit. Contact the Maintenance Department to request current pricing and schedules.

Moving Boxes

Crestwood Village 1 will remove, for free, any moving boxes for new members. Please break down the boxes and stack in an orderly fashion, then call the Maintenance Department and we will remove the boxes for you. This service is only provided once to new members.

HOPA The Housing for Older People Act

What is a HOPA?

The Housing for Older People Act* (HOPA) was approved by the Senate and House of Representatives and signed into law in 1995. This federal law states that it is legal for communities to market themselves as "55+"or "age-restricted" provided they maintain that 80% of the residential units are occupied by at least one person who is 55 years of age or older. However, if the number of persons age 55+ in a given community falls below the 80% threshold, CV1 could lose its age-restricted status (and loss of such status would be permanent).

Every two years (odd Years), the State of New Jersey mandates all age restricted communities HOA's collect a HOPA Survey from every living unit. The collection of data requests provisioning of the names of all residential occupants, ages and dates of birth.

How Can We Keep Our 55+ Status

With 100% community participation we can prove that 80% of Crestwood Village 1 meets the necessary age requirement under the HOPA law. Your participation is essential to ensure our community maintains its HOPA status.

We have many members who did not fill out the HOPA form. It is in this newsletter on the following page. Please fill it out and drop it off at the office or put in the mailbox in front of the clubhouse.

HOPA Survey (Housing for Older People Act)

The HOPA provides housing for older persons and is intended for occupancy by at least one person 55 years of age or older per unit. It requires that periodically information must be collected and verified with the age of all residents. If a survey is not completed, the senior housing community could lose its housing status.

It is mandatory that this survey be completed and filed with the Co-Op office.

Its summer time and a great time to get some shots at the beach and pool. On crowded beaches you can shoot the people, activities, and colorful umbrellas. On remote beaches you can look for wildlife, patterns in the sand, or great cloud formations against the water, There's always sunrise images early in the morning. Don't forget sunscreen and a hat!

The challenge with beach shots is getting the proper exposure. Your camera is designed to give you an average exposure of the entire scene. This is why most of your images are properly exposed. A very bright scene tricks you camera into thinking there is too much light, so the camera will cut back on exposure. To compensate you should increase the exposure slightly. If your camera has "scene" modes, use the one for snow or beach.

A great way to enhance your images is using a polarizing filter, which cuts glare the same as polarizing sunglasses. Many photographers use this filter to make the sky in their images darker (and the clouds brighter) but this filter works wonderfully to show the detail in the sand and to remove the reflections in the water. This also works well for images around the pool.


