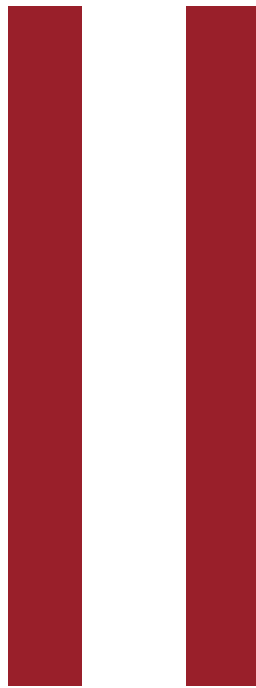

Hello Residents of Village 1

Total Work Orders Closed (past 30 calendar days) = 281

Time for another monthly installment of the Crestwood Village 1 Maintenance Minute! There are so many new residents out here, I might just recommend that everyone starts wearing name tags! With the high turn-over rate within Village 1, I have seen and heard some confusion with what's covered by a Co-op, what am I responsible for, and what kind of work related tasks will and will not require Permission Request Forms. As always, if you are not sure about something, there are several ways to reach out to ask a question about your specific situation. Not only are we nosey neighbors, but often times we can offer advice to save the residents time and money...not too much we haven't come across out here!

Making a Work Request

1. Walk-ins are still not permitted at the Maintenance Building. Our parking lot and garage area can be dangerous, lots of vehicles moving around and uneven pavement...we've also had our fair share of residents pulling up to our garage door that have run into Maintenance vehicles or the building while trying to navigate through. We do have a drop box by our Maintenance Building door, if you must utilize this, please park in a designated spot in the parking lot and walk to the door to drop off your request.
2. Alternatively, a resident can enter Friendship Hall and hand deliver notes or requests to the Trustees Office or utilize the tan drop box in front of Friendship Hall.

Permission Request Form

1. Are intended to notify Village 1 of upcoming work to your respective unit. Generally, these are requested for larger projects, but can be submitted for anything...can't hurt if you are not sure. The form itself is very generic, we are looking for resident information, the type of work being requested, contractor information and any applicable insurance and license information. As a Co-op, we are very interested in any alterations being made to the units as we have a vested interest in ensuring the work is being completed by a reputable contractor, the work is in line with what is acceptable by the Co-op and that contractors are meeting the Village's insurance requirements. We also request that drawings, specifications, pictures, diagrams, a list of materials or any information pertinent to your proposed work are provided for review.
2. Examples of work that would require a Permission Request Form include, but are not limited to: Removal or addition of walls, changes to the building footprint, bath/kitchen remodels, door or window replacements, addition of new electrical (fixtures, plugs or switches), air conditioning, changes to plumbing, patios and 3 season rooms.
3. Examples of work that would not require a Permission Request Form: replacing existing plumbing fixtures, replacing electrical fixtures/switches/outlets, painting, replacement of appliances.
4. IF ANY WORK IS COMPLETED WHERE A PERMISSION REQUEST FORM WAS NOT SUBMITTED AND APPROVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES, THE RESIDENT OR THE ESTATE OF THE RESIDENT WILL BE FINANCIALLY RESPONSIBLE TO REVERT WHATEVER CHANGES WERE MADE, BACK TO THE ORIGINAL (OR AS CLOSE TO) CONDITION. The Co-op does an inspection when units go up for sale, so eventually, these renovations will be brought to light and addressed then.
5. The Co-op has had several instances where we have had to have work reverted, this is something that can be avoided.
6. No work can be completed without an approved Permission Request Form and the Co-op does reserve the right to shut down any job happening in Village 1 if they deem it necessary.

Other General Information (which might prove useful!)

1. Only certain subcontractors are permitted to enter the crawlspace without Maintenance oversight. The Co-op has assumed responsibility for the crawlspace and far too many times we've seen contractors leave work debris, down insulation, wires everywhere and general bad housekeeping which the Village has to go and clean up after. Contractors are required to take their trash with them.
2. **NOBODY BUT THE MAINTENANCE DEPARTMENT CAN TURN OFF THE MAIN WATER SUPPLIES TO BUILDINGS AND UNITS. IF A CONTRACTOR ATTEMPTS TO TURN THE WATER OFF AND ON AND THE VALVE FAILS, IT IS THE FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY OF THE RESIDENT TO PERFORM REPAIRS TO THE CRAWLSPACE, NEIGHBORING UNITS OR ANY OTHER DAMAGE RESULTING IN ATTEMPTING TO OPERATE THE WATER CONTROLS.**
3. The 3' perimeter around your unit is the resident's responsibility. Any trimming or removal in this area is chargeable to the resident. The Co-op also requests that if new plantings are being proposed that the Village is made aware so we can check on species and number of plantings to make sure they are acceptable for the proposed location.
4. Anything outside of the 3' perimeter is considered common ground and no plantings or removals should be made without proper notification or work requests.
5. Only white entry doors and storm doors are permitted in the Village.

Again, the biggest thing I can stress is being transparent with what you are doing and who will be doing the work. Make a call, send an email, but try to have a conversation with someone in either the Trustees Office or the Maintenance Department to see if the work you are proposing is allowed. This is more than just information to provide the Co-op, it also is a means in which we can help you find and hire reliable subcontractors. We have had experiences with a multitude of contractors and we had some good and some bad, but we do in general keep information on them all so none of our residents are taken advantage of.
