There are many state holidays and days of observance, too many to list, and of course we with have Halloween. It's celebrated as a day of fun but it has a somewhat dark history.

Web: The origins of the Halloween holiday date back thousands of years. Here is the story of the traces of the original lore that remain and how we went from carving turnips in the British Isles to spending \$3 billion on candy annually in the United States. Halloween as we know it is a secular celebration with roots in the Celtic harvest festival of Samhain, which was observed in ancient Britain and Ireland on November 1st. Samhain marked the halfway point between the autumn equinox and the winter solstice, the beginning of the new year. This coincided with a seasonal harvest and the start of winter preparations. This was also the day during which the Celts believed that the veil between the mortal and the supernatural was thinnest. Priests held rituals, and people lit bonfires to brighten the dark to scare away supernatural beings. People donned masks to disguise themselves from the ghosts, faeries, and demons that were thought to roam this night. In the 7th century, Pope Boniface IV established All Saints' Day in May. The date of this celebration was later moved to November 1st, possibly to overshadow any pagan traditions of Samhain, possibly because coinciding with the harvest meant there were more resources available at that time of year. Either way, this made the night before, October 31st, All Saints' Eve or All Hallows' Eve, hence Halloween. Later, All Souls' Day was proclaimed on November 2nd, introducing another Christian religious holiday to the period. Together, beginning with Halloween on October 31st, these three days are sometimes called Allhallowtide. By the end of the 15th century, All Hallows' Eve had become a blend of sacred and secular. Secular celebrations remained especially strong in Britain, Ireland, and Scotland. One of the customs in Ireland in the 1800s involved carving vegetables—usually turnips, potatoes, or beets—into frightening faces to scare off spirits. These designs evolved to hold candles, as metal lanterns

were prohibitively expensive for most people. A museum in Ireland is still exhibiting a preserved "ghost turnip" today. When a number of Irish people immigrated to the United States in the mid-1800s to escape the Great Famine, they brought their Halloween traditions with them. They found pumpkins and other gourds, native to America, especially suitable for carving, giving rise to the now ubiquitous jack o'lanterns. Halloween grew in popularity, becoming one of the primary holidays in the United States by the 20th century.

Samhain was a Gaelic festival celebrated by the Celts around November 1st to mark the end of the harvest season and the beginning of the dark, cold winter.

Supernatural Beliefs: Celts believed that on the night of October 31st, the boundaries between the living and the dead blurred, allowing the spirits of the deceased to return to earth.

Traditions: People lit bonfires and wore costumes made of animal skins to ward off evil spirits and prevent them from entering their homes.

Christian Influence: All Saints Day: In the 8th century, Pope Gregory III established November 1st as All Saints Day, a day to honor Christian saints.

All Hallows Eve: The evening before All Saints Day became known as All Hallows Eve, or "All Hallows Even," which eventually shortened to Halloween.

All Souls Day: November 2nd was established as All Souls Day, a day to honor all the departed souls.

Happy Fall to the Members of Village 1!

Total Work Orders Completed (past 30 days) = 296

Well, it didn't take long for the leaves to change and start falling. This month I would like to discuss some items regarding the changing seasons and what you can do to help prepare yourself for the cooler months ahead. As most of us already know, we can get some heavy winds ripping through the Village which can and probably will cause damage in one way or another... hopefully this article will help you to prepare. If there is any damage from something of yours hitting into another person's property (Co-op included) you will be financially responsible for any related damages.

Lawn Décor

It's about that time to start breaking down your Summertime related décor and furniture. Please pull in any lawn furniture you have out, either on a patio or on the lawns. Close and store any umbrellas, remove canopy/gazebo covers and any seasonal items should be removed. Crestwood Village 1 respectfully requests that these items be stored in garages, sheds or porches for safekeeping. If you cannot store items in any of these locations, then please NEATLY store them against your unit, in a location that will not be a potential eyesore for the next 6 months. Just a reminder, there should be no gasoline cans or propane tanks left around your building.

Brush and Bag Procedure

Every Thursday, the Village 1 Co-op provides removal of brush and bags for our members. Please take advantage of this awesome service. There are several guidelines for you to follow to make this as efficient as possible, especially when considering the 1,016 individual units that are present here in Village 1.

The Village 1 Co-op requests that on-street parking be limited on Thursday's brush and bag pickups. Especially down in the courts, people tend to "spread out", making it very difficult for our large grass truck to make it through sometimes. If there are excessive vehicles on the streets or down the courts at the time of service and the workers deem the situation hazardous, they have been directed to go past the street or court and will not make a return trip until the following Thursday. If the situation continues, the Village 1 Co-op will revisit the on-street parking policy here in Village 1.

1. Brush and bags must be out the night before or by no later than 6:30 AM the morning of Thursday's pickup;
2. Raking and/or blowing the leaves to the curbs is NOT PERMITTED and will not be picked up the Co-op;
3. There will be no return trips or doubling back for calls regarding missed pickups or late callers. There are 5 workers on the trucks doing the pickups and is highly unlikely that we are missing any piles or bags;
4. Typically, there are 2 vehicles making the rounds, 1 for brush and 1 for bags;
5. Brown paper recyclable lawn and leaf bags are the only types of bags permitted to be picked up and used for yard clean ups;
6. These bags are for leaves, pine needles, acorns and pine cones;
7. The workers will leave your bags if there is evidence of improper materials stored; sticks, planters, excessive soil, grass cuttings, rocks, etc. or if it is too heavy. The intended materials are not heavy and should not make the bags heavy enough where the workers struggle to get them in the truck;
8. These rules are promulgated by Manchester Township and they can revoke our dumping privileges if they are not abided to;
9. Brush is to be left in neat piles by the curbside, on the lawn;
10. The brush will be picked up and chipped up as we make our way;
11. Root balls will not be picked up and arrangements will have to be made for separate pickups;
12. Members should not be clearing the common grounds and bringing this material to the curb;
13. Excessively large piles of brush may not be picked up. If it appears that the brush piles were left by a subcontractor, a call will be placed to the resident, as it is pretty obvious when this occurs.

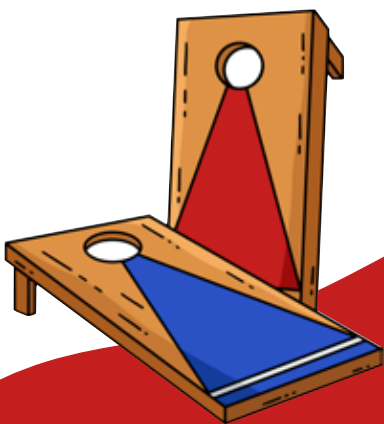
